1. The object of the Governor's Cup award is to encourage Exhibitors to compete with the highest quality pedigree breeding exhibits and reward both excellence and consistency throughout the whole range of their exhibits.
2. The Governor's Cup is only open to bonafide Western Australian Exhibitors. Government Institutions including Agricultural Schools and Colleges are eligible to compete.
3. **ALL ANIMALS ARE TO BE ENTIRE** e.g. Geldings and spayed mares are not allowed.
4. Sections and Breed classes in which points can be gained are as follows with exclusions as stated:
 - **Alpaca:**
First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Group and Special classes.
 - **Cattle:**
First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Progeny, Group and Special classes.
 - **Goats:**
First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Progeny and Group classes.
 - **Horses:**
 - First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Ridden, Group and Special classes.
 - **Sheep:**
First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes and Pairs, but excluding Novice, Group and Special classes.
5. All livestock exhibits must be either:
 - a. Bred by the Exhibitor, or owned, leased or syndicated by the Exhibitor for a minimum of six (6) months as at the date of judging and provide proof of the transaction by way of receipts or registration papers.
 - b. Exhibited by the original owner under arrangement with the purchaser.
4. The Exhibitor can enter all classes in their breed section, but the maximum number of classes for which an Exhibitor will gain Governor's Cup points are from the highest scoring ten (10) Single Pen classes. In the event of a tie for first place, the Governor's Cup will be jointly awarded.
5. An **EXHIBIT** is **DEFINED**, for the purposes of this award, as follows:
 - As per Single Pen classes. **AN EXHIBIT MAY ONLY RECEIVE POINTS ONCE.**
6. Points will be allotted as follows:
 - **First 4 points**
 - **Second 2 points**
 - **Third 1 point**

If an Exhibitor has multiple placing's within a class then all placing points will be included in the total for that class. Championships will **NOT** be included unless the circumstances below apply:
7. Points will not be allocated unless at least **TWO (2) EXHIBITORS** participate in each class except in the event of the animal going on to win a Championship or Reserve Championship with competition, in which case points scored on the Governor's up scale will be awarded for the original class in which the animal competed. If an animal has not been awarded any Governor's Cup points because it faced no competition in its breed or section, but that animal goes on to win an award with competition, points scored on the Governor's Cup scale will be awarded for the original class in which the animal competed.
8. Livestock sections should address a means of promoting excellence within their respective areas. It will lead to competition across the sections.
9. Declaration on Entry Form: To be eligible for participation in the Governor's Cup Competition you must have signed the Declaration on the entry form to acknowledge that you have read all the Rules and Regulations governing the Governor's Cup Competition and you agree to abide by them

Terms and Conditions

General Regulations

The General Show Regulations apply to all competitions of the Show. These Conditions apply to the Mohair Fleece Competition only. If there is inconsistency between the General Show Regulations and these Conditions for the Mohair Fleece Competition, these Conditions prevail.

Upon acceptance of an entry the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by the General Show Regulations and these Conditions.

A copy of the Society's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or downloaded from the website <http://perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations>.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Mohair Fleece Competition Conditions may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

The Society may recognise and act upon any penalty imposed by any other similar society, organisation or body in Australia on any person or exhibit.

Liability And Indemnity

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to the Society's Liability and Indemnity.

Dairy Goats Conditions

1. Conditions of Entry

Entries must be lodged on the official Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia website at <http://entries.perthroyalshow.com.au>.

2. Refund of Entry Fees

Entry fees will not be refunded if an entry is withdrawn, rejected or disqualified for any reason.

Refunds will only be issued where the Society receives excess entries in a section or class and is unable to accommodate them.

3. Event Schedule

The Silver Jubilee Pavilion will be open to the public from 10.00am to 6.00pm daily.

Judging of Classes 1 to 48 will commence on Thursday, 1 October 2026. Judging of Classes 49 to 99 will commence on Friday, 2 October 2026. Competitors should ensure entries are prepared and available for judging at the times directed.

A presentation ceremony and social BBQ for Competitors, Stewards and Judges will be held on Friday, 2 October 2026 following the completion of judging.

4. Advertising

No notice or advertisement, other than that authorised by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, shall appear on any show pen, or anywhere in the pavilion.

Competitors must not display any material that, in the opinion of the Stewards, could influence the Judge.

Stud promotional signage may be displayed on pens from the first day of the Show, provided it does not exceed the height of the pen.

Advertising the sale of animals is not permitted.

5. Registrations

Dairy Goats must be registered in a recognised Herd Book and registered numbers or grades must be stated on the application for entry. Where goats are not of age for Herd Book numbers, registration must have been applied for at the time of close of entries, with the Dairy Goat Society of Australia.

Dairy Goat registration certificates must be submitted with the application for entry.

Entries in the goat classes will be inspected prior to judging in order to see that they are tattooed or fitted with an RFID device in accordance with the rules of the Dairy Goat Society of Australia. Any goat not correctly tattooed/RFID identified will not be eligible to compete.

Each animal may be subject to inspection and/or examination by an Inspector or Inspectors appointed by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA.

6. Withdrawal of Entry

A veterinary certificate must be provided to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA if an entry is withdrawn due to illness or injury.

7. Restriction of Entries

Competitors are not restricted on the number of entries they can enter in any one (1) class.

8. Substitutions

Direct substitutions will only be accepted in 2026. A direct substitution is the replacement of an animal of the exact same breed and age.

All substitutions must be made to the Competition Supervisor prior to 11 September 2026.

9. 24 Hour Production Tests

All does entered in the 24-hour milk test must be milked out commencing at 7.00pm, Wednesday, 30 September 2026 under the supervision of the Chief Steward or their authorised representative.

No goat entered in the 24-hour production tests shall be fed with milk or milk substitutes, or receive any stimulants, medicine, drench or injection, between the time of their arrival at the Showground and the completion of the test, without permission of the Chief Steward or a Veterinarian.

10. Does In Milk Or Dry

At the discretion of the competitor, any doe which has been milked for at least nine (9) months and is in kid may be classed as dry.

Any doe which has kidded within nine (9) months shall be regarded as in milk. Any goat in milk, which is entered as a dry goat, must be milked out before judging.

Any doe entered in milk which is not already entered in the 24-hour milk test must be milked out at 7.00pm, Thursday, 1 October 2026 under the supervision of the Chief Steward or their authorised representative.

11. Livestock Movement & Biosecurity

Interstate Entry Into Western Australia

All livestock entering Western Australia must comply with the import requirements set by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD). A completed Health Certificate for Movement of Stock to Western Australia (Form LB1) must accompany each consignment of livestock entering the State. The form outlines the applicable import conditions and certifies that the livestock meet Western Australia's biosecurity requirements. Competitors are responsible for ensuring all documentation is completed correctly prior to travel. For further information, please contact DPIRD or visit the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development website.

Movement Within Western Australia

Whenever livestock are moved within Western Australia, the relevant movement documentation must accompany the consignment in accordance with National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) and state biosecurity requirements. A correctly completed National Vendor Declaration (NVD), waybill and/or permit must identify the property of origin and destination, including the Property Identification Codes (PICs) for both locations.

All livestock must comply with current NLIS identification and traceability requirements, including the use of approved identification devices and any exemption arrangements permitted under relevant legislation.

Competitors are responsible for ensuring all animals are correctly tagged prior to arrival at the Showground, and that all required documentation accompanies the livestock and is provided to the Competition Supervisor or their representative upon arrival.

The Property Identification Code (PIC) for the Claremont Showgrounds is WCSG0001.

Caprine Arthritis Encephalitis (CAE)

Entries in the Goat Section will only be accepted from CAE free herds. Proof of a clear CAE test result for each animal entered must be provided to the Competition Supervisor or their authorised representative upon arrival at the Showground.

As of 13 May 2020, CAE testing may be conducted by either a veterinarian or the owner in accordance with the relevant requirements.

Liver Fluke

All goats entering Western Australia from interstate must comply with current Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) liver fluke import requirements, including any testing, treatment and certification requirements outlined on the relevant LB1 Health Certificate. Competitors are responsible for ensuring all requirements are met prior to entry into Western Australia. For further information, please contact DPIRD or visit the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development website.

12. Animal Health

A veterinarian will be on call throughout the Show to attend to any sick or injured livestock. Competitors requiring veterinary assistance will be responsible for all costs associated with the services provided.

The Veterinary Office is located at the corner of Edgar Avenue and the Cattle Lanes.

The duty Veterinary Office can be contacted through Asset Services on (08) 6263 3161 or (08) 6263 3146 between 6:00am and 9:00pm from Thursday, 24 September to Sunday, 4 October (until 12:00 noon). For assistance after 9:00pm, please contact Asset Services on (08) 6263 3127.

13. Fodder And Bedding

Bedding

Straw bedding will be supplied in large bales and moved throughout the pavilion via pallet jack for ease of distribution and safety purposes. Competitors are asked to ensure a minimum of two people assist when restocking bedding from the bales into pens. Bedding should be used sparingly to minimise waste and assist with overall pavilion cleanliness and supply management.

Pine shavings will be provided as a base underneath the straw bedding.

Competitors are requested to assist in maintaining a clean and safe pavilion by keeping pens free from waste and ensuring access ways remain clear of straw and waste throughout the Show. This will assist with biosecurity, animal health and general presentation of the area. Competitors are also asked to assist with the clean-out of their pens on departure, which will help reduce cleaning costs and keep entry fees as low as possible for Competitors. All required equipment will be supplied.

Fodder

All animals must be fed and cared for by the Competitor or their representative while on the Showgrounds.

Fodder will be available for purchase by Competitors upon entry.

A shared fodder storage room will be available for Competitors throughout the competition. Please note that individual lockers will not be provided in 2026. Competitors are requested to use the area respectfully and considerately to help maintain a clean, organised and accessible space for all users.

14. Ticketing and Passes

Competitors will receive admission, vehicle and parking passes. All passes will be issued electronically during the week prior to the Show.

- Admission passes will be allocated automatically based on the number of animals entered, as follows:
 - 1 to 6 animals: Two (2) multi-entry passes
 - 7 or more animals: Three (3) multi-entry passes
- Vehicle passes must be requested at the time of entry and will be issued based on the number of vehicles required to load and unload livestock.
- Parking at Irwin Barracks must be requested at the time of entry and will be issued based on the number of vehicles nominated. Parking is charged at \$10 per vehicle, per day. No Competitor vehicles are permitted to remain parked on the Showground. Following unloading, all vehicles and trailers must be removed from the Showground and parked at Irwin Barracks.

If all passes have not been received by Tuesday, 24 September 2026, Competitors should contact the Competition Supervisor.

15. Accommodation

Camping accommodation will be permitted in the upstairs mezzanine area of the Silver Jubilee Pavilion.

Accommodation bookings must be made at the time of entry. Any Competitor staying overnight on the Showground will also be required to complete an Overnight Stay Application Form, which will be emailed to the registered email address following entry.

A lanyard and accommodation pass will be issued on the first day of booked accommodation and must be worn and clearly visible at all times between 9.00pm and 10.00am.

Competitors are required to provide their own bedding and camping supplies.

16. Arrival and Departure

Arrival

Competitor access to the Showground will be via Gate 6, with exit via Gate 5. Both gates are located on Graylands Road.

Competitors must arrive either on Tuesday, 29 September 2026 from 8.00pm, or on Wednesday, 30 September 2026 between 5.00am and 9.30am.

Arrival days will be allocated by the Competition Supervisor after entries have closed. Competitors must adhere to their designated arrival and departure times, as access through the gates will only be permitted during approved periods. As a general guide, Competitors travelling more than 200km to the Showground will be allocated Tuesday evening arrival, while those located closer will generally be allocated Wednesday morning arrival.

Competitors must follow their allocated arrival day as directed.

All animals must be penned and ready by 10.00am.

Vehicles and trailers must be removed from the Showground immediately following unloading. Parking is available at Irwin Barracks at a cost of \$10 per day and can be booked at the time of entry.

All required documentation must be presented to the Competition Supervisor or their representative upon arrival. This includes the NVD/Waybill and CAE test results (refer to Point 9 for further information).

Departure

A Livestock Release Authority Form must be completed and approved before leaving the Showground.

Animals must not be removed prior to 6.00pm on Saturday, 3 October 2026 unless prior approval has been granted by Royal Agricultural Society of WA.

Competitors who remove Exhibits before this time without approval will forfeit any prizes and/or prize money awarded.

17. Competitor Responsibilities

All Competitors or their authorised representative must be in attendance and responsible for presentation of Exhibit(s) to Judges.

Any Competitor or their authorised representative not bringing forward their Exhibit(s) to compete forfeits their right to pens allotted to such animals.

A person who has the care or charge of an animal has a duty to take all reasonable measures to ensure the welfare of that animal.

18. Presentation of Awards

Placings and ribbons will only be awarded where entries are deemed by the Judge to have met the standard typically required for that place. If, in the opinion of the Judge, the quality of an entry does not meet the necessary standard, a ribbon may be withheld, regardless of the number of entries in the class.

Prize money will be awarded as indicated in the Competition Schedule.

19. Protests Against Awards

A Competitor may protest against an award won by an entry in the same class alleging breach of Royal Agricultural Society of WA's General Show Regulations, Section Conditions, or ineligibility.

Such protest must be made in writing, giving reasons for the protest and signed and submitted to the Council Lead and Competition Supervisor not more than one (1) hour after the completion of the judging of the class or competition.

Such protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which may be forfeited to Royal Agricultural Society of Western AustraliaWA if in the opinion of the Council Lead and Competition Supervisor the protest is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious. If an entry or Competitor is awarded a prize and is subsequently disqualified, the prize will not automatically be awarded to the next placegetter. The final decision will be at the discretion of the Judge.

Any prize money awarded for an event, which is the subject of protest, shall be retained by Royal Agricultural Society of Western AustraliaWA until the protest has been resolved.

20. Electric Appliances

The use of double adaptors is not permitted.

Multiway outlets (power boards) with overload protectors must carry a current test tag. Competitors must only use electrical appliances, extension cords, power boards and lights which carry current test tags. A validated tag must show the date that it was tested, the name of the person who tested it, and that person's electrical workers license number.

21. Prize Money

Prize money won during the Perth Royal Show will be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer). Please complete your account details on the application for entry.

The Society aims to finalise all prize money payments by the end of November. Any prize money that remains unclaimed for more than six (6) months will be considered forfeited by the Competitor.

Prize money as stated in the Schedule does not include GST. The prize money which the Society pays to successful Competitors ("you") depends on the information that you provide to the Society

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN), the Society will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. The Society will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice.

Furthermore, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You are requested not to issue a tax invoice to the Society in respect of prize money received.
- It will be necessary for you to notify the Society if you cease to be registered for GST: and
- the Society will notify you if it ceases to satisfy any of the requirements of determination.

If you provide your ABN but are not registered for GST, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

You must complete the Taxation Details on the Application Entry. Failure to do so will result in the Society deducting 47% of the successful Competitor's prize money under the ATO PAYG provisions.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

22. Awards

The Society will not be responsible for awards not received by competitors after 31 December 2026. If you have not received your award by 30 November 2026, please contact the Royal Agricultural Society of WA on (08) 6263 3100.

23. Promotion

No advertising or promotion on behalf of commercial business will be permitted on the Showground without the prior written consent of the Society's Chief Executive Officer.

24. Privacy Act Statement

The information provided by the Competitor in the application for entry is collected and used by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA to organise and conduct competitions at the Show. We may publish details such as your name, address, and entrant details in any Royal Agricultural Society of WA publication or communication. Such information may also be made available to and published by the media. We will not disclose your information without your consent for any other purpose unless required or authorised by law. You may request access to your personal information and, if necessary, request that our records of that information be corrected by writing to the Chief Executive Officer at the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, PO Box 135, Claremont WA 6910.

2. All kids entered must be tattooed/RFID as required by DGSA registration.
3. **Entries Close:** 5.00pm, Friday, 11 September 2026.
4. **Judging:** Will commence at 10.30am on Thursday, 1 October 2026 in the judging ring.

Terms and Conditions

General Regulations

The General Show Regulations apply to all competitions of the Show. These Conditions apply to the Mohair Fleece Competition only. If there is inconsistency between the General Show Regulations and these Conditions for the Mohair Fleece Competition, these Conditions prevail.

Upon acceptance of an entry the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by the General Show Regulations and these Conditions.

A copy of the Society's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or downloaded from the website <http://perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations>.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Mohair Fleece Competition Conditions may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

The Society may recognise and act upon any penalty imposed by any other similar society, organisation or body in Australia on any person or exhibit.

Liability And Indemnity

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to the Society's Liability and Indemnity.

Mohair Fleece Conditions

1. Conditions of Entry

Entries must be lodged on the official Royal Agricultural Society of WA application for entry or online at <http://entries.perthroyalshow.com.au>.

2. Refund of Entry Fees

No refunds will be given for livestock or fleece exhibits except where the Society has excess entries in a section or class and is unable to accommodate them.

If an exhibit is withdrawn, rejected or disqualified by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA for any reason, the entry fee will NOT be refunded.

3. Pavilion Opening Times

The Jim Horwood Pavilion will be open to the public from 10.00am to 6.00pm daily.

4. Advertising

No notice or advertisement, other than that authorised by Royal Agricultural Society of WA, shall appear on any show pen, or anywhere in the pavilion.

No exhibit or pen will display any material that may, in the opinion of the Stewards, influence the Judge.

Stud promotional signage may be displayed on pens from the first day of the Show.

Advertising material must not exceed the height of the pen. No animal "For Sale" signage is to be displayed on pens.

5. Protests Against Awards

A Competitor may protest against an award won by an exhibit or Competitor in the same class alleging breach of the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's General Show Regulations, Section Conditions, or ineligibility.

Such protest must be made in writing, giving reasons for the protest and signed and submitted to the Councillor in Charge not more than one (1) hour after the completion of the judging of the event or competition.

Such protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which may be forfeited to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA if in the opinion of the Councillor in Charge the protest is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious. If an exhibit is awarded a prize and is subsequently disqualified, the prize will not automatically be awarded to the next placegetter. The final decision will be at the discretion of the Judge.

Any prize money awarded for an event, which is the subject of protest, shall be retained by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA until the protest has been resolved.

6. Presentation of Awards

Placings and ribbons will only be awarded where exhibits are deemed by the Judge to have met the standard typically required for that place. If, in the opinion of the Judge, the quality of an exhibit does not meet the necessary standard, a ribbon may be withheld, regardless of the number of entries in the class.

Competitors, Stewards and Judges are invited to a social BBQ on Friday, 2 October 2026 at 6.00pm to celebrate another successful Perth Royal Show.

7. Restrictions of Entries

All mohair must be grown in Western Australia. Exhibitors are limited to three (3) entries per class and the Royal Agricultural Society of WA reserves the right to further restrict entries to two (2) per class, after entries close, if found necessary because of lack of accommodation.

All fleeces must be unwashed and skirted to the satisfaction of the Judge. The fleeces must be delivered in an unmarked cardboard box or paper bag. No identification of the owner is permitted to be printed on or placed within the packaging of the submitted mohair fleece(s). Submitted mohair fleeces may only be accompanied by the official Royal Agricultural Society of WA entry form.

Mohair fleeces will be anonymised prior to fleece sample analysis and presentation to Judges and will be identified only by a number for the purposes of judging.

Mohair fleeces entered into a class which is different to the fleece analysis results will be placed in the class appropriate to those results, without penalty.

Placings and ribbons will only be awarded where exhibits are deemed by the Judge to have met the standard typically required for that placing. If, in the opinion of the Judge, the quality of an exhibit does not meet the necessary standard, a ribbon may be withheld, regardless of the number of entries in the class. All exhibits will be judged on the scale of points shown on the judging card, and scorecards will be attached to each exhibit after judging.

8. Exhibit Deliveries

All fleeces must be delivered to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA (Claremont Showground) by 5pm on Monday 17 August 2026. Please arrange a date and time for deliveries with Michaela Crosby (Competition Supervisor) at michaela.crosby@raswa.org.au or call 6263 3157.

9. Exhibit Collection

From Sunday, 4 October 2026 or at the discretion of the Royal Agricultural Society of WA.

10. Scoring and Judging

All fleece testing will be conducted by an independent laboratory as determined by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA.

Each Judge is given a scorecard and the fleece analysis results and will assign scores based on both objective and subjective characteristics, with a maximum possible score of 100.

Each fleece will receive comments from the Judge regarding its characteristics and test results and will be displayed with its scorecard and fleece analysis results after judging for the duration of the Perth Royal Show.

Mohair fleeces must be skirted to the standard of commercial presentation i.e. little to no stain, minimal presence of vegetable matter, no dags, minimal matted fleece and must weigh between 1-2kg per entry.

The same mohair fleece may be entered in both hand spinning and top making classes of the same micron category.

Fleeces should be allocated using the following micron scale:

- 1ST SHEAR up to 18
- FINE 18.1 to 24
- MEDIUM 24.1 to 30
- STRONG 30.1 and above

Each fleece will be allocated a per kg price (commercial value) corresponding to the total score awarded for each of the objective and subjective characteristics. The per kg fleece price (commercial value) reflects the total score awarded, and placings are therefore determined accordingly.

The score and per kg price are included on the scorecard.

Each fleece will receive comments from the Judge regarding its characteristics and commercial value and will be displayed with its scorecard and fleece analysis results after judging for the duration of the Perth Royal Show.

Prize money as stated in the Schedule does not include GST. The prize money which the Society pays to successful Competitors ("you") depends on the information that you provide to the Society.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN) the Society will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. The Society will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice.

Furthermore, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You are requested not to issue a tax invoice to the Society in respect of prize money received.
- It will be necessary for you to notify the Society if you cease to be registered for GST; and
