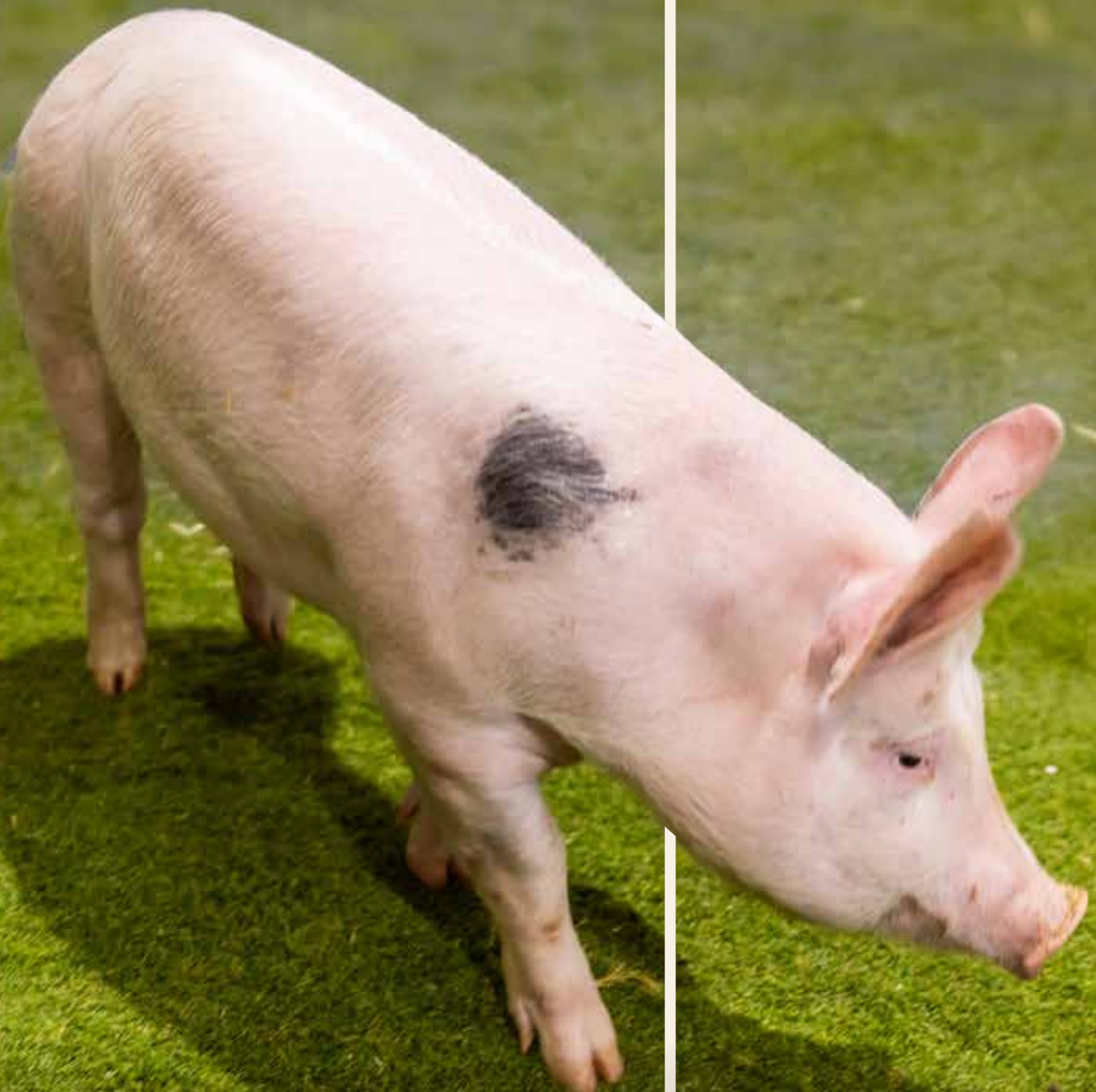

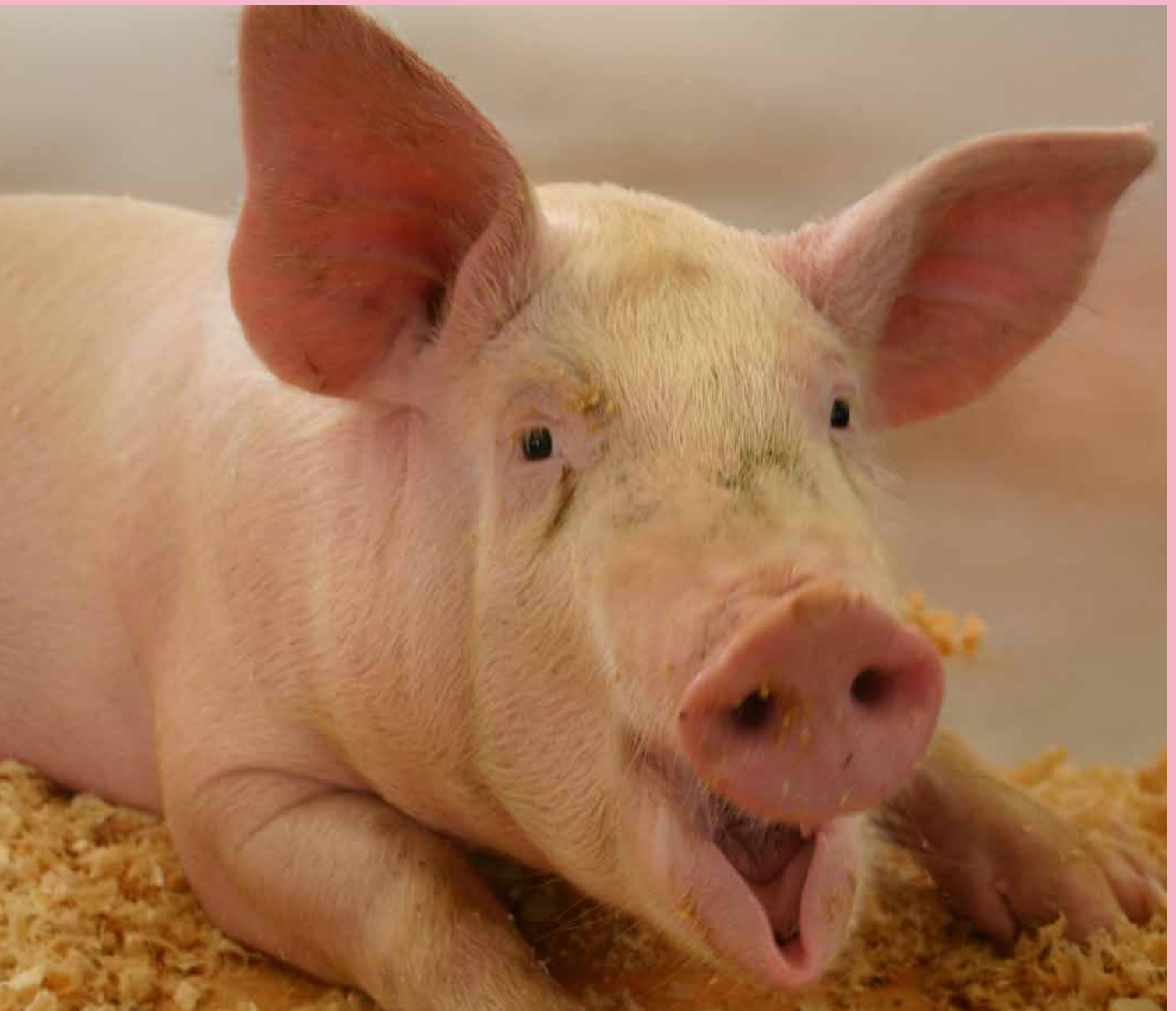

Terms and Conditions

General Regulations

The General Show Regulations apply to all competitions of the Show. These Conditions apply to the Pig Stud competition only. If there is inconsistency between the General Show Regulations and these Conditions for the Pig Stud competition, these Conditions prevail.

Upon acceptance of an entry the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by the General Show Regulations and these Conditions.

A copy of the Society's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or downloaded from the website <http://perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations>.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Pig Stud Conditions may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

The Society may recognise and act upon any penalty imposed by any other similar society, organisation or body in Australia on any person or Exhibit.

Liability And Indemnity

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to the Society's Liability and Indemnity.

Prize Money

Prize money won during the Perth Royal Show will be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer). Please complete your account details on the application for entry.

The Society aims to finalise all prize money payments by the end of November. Any prize money that remains unclaimed for more than six months will be considered forfeited by the Competitor.

Prize money as stated in the Schedule does not include GST. The prize money which the Society pays to successful Competitors ("you") depends on the information that you provide to the Society.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN) the Society will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. The Society will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice.

Furthermore, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You are requested not to issue a tax invoice to the Society in respect of prize money received.
- It will be necessary for you to notify the Society if you cease to be registered for GST: and
- The Society will notify you if it ceases to satisfy any of the requirements of determination.

If you provide your ABN but are not registered for GST, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

You must complete the Taxation Details on the Application Entry. Failure to do so will result in the Society deducting 47% of the successful Competitor's prize money under the ATO PAYG provisions.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

Awards

The Society will not be responsible for awards not received by Exhibitors after 31 December 2026. If you have not received your award by 30 November 2026, please contact the Royal Agricultural Society of WA on (08) 6263 3100.

Promotion

No advertising or promotion on behalf of commercial businesses will be permitted on the Showground without the prior written consent of the Society's Chief Executive Officer.

Privacy Act Statement

The information provided by the Exhibitor in the application for entry is collected and used by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA to organise and conduct competitions at the Show. We may publish details such as your name, address and exhibit details in any Royal Agricultural Society of WA publication or communication. Such information may also be made available to and published by the media. We will not disclose your information without your consent for any other purpose unless required or authorised by law. You may request access to your personal information and, if necessary, request that our records of that information be corrected by writing to the Chief Executive Officer at the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, PO Box 135, Claremont WA 6910.

Pig Stud Special Regulations Interpretation

1. In these Regulations, unless there be something in the subject or context inconsistent there with:

Breeder in relation to an animal means the Person who is the Owner of the dam of that animal at the date when the animal is kidded.

Exhibitor means the Person on whose behalf and in whose name the Application for Entry is lodged with and accepted by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA and includes the representatives and agents of an Exhibitor.

Pen in the context of an animal enclosure may contain one or more animals.

Person includes a firm, partnership, company or corporation.

Show Society means a country pastoral and agricultural society or association.

Age Of Pigs

Age of pigs (litter classes excepted) to be calculated from the birth date shown in the registration in the herd book up to 2026. The age of piglets in litter Classes shall be actual age at the date of judging.

Withdrawals

- Every animal entered must be exhibited unless a certificate signed by the Exhibitor is lodged with the Society at least 14 days before the opening day of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete.
- All withdrawals must include Exhibitor name, Exhibit name, class number and Exhibit number (if known).
- Withdrawals can be sent via email to education@raswa.org.au and clearly marked "Withdrawal - Pig Section".
- Verbal withdrawals will not be accepted.
- A fine of \$50 may be imposed for all late withdrawals unless notified by a statutory declaration setting out full reasons for withdrawal, together with an explanatory certificate signed by a veterinary surgeon.
- Notification must be received prior to 9.00am on Saturday, 19 September 2026.
- Non-payment of these fines will debar exhibitors from parading their remaining pigs before the judge.

Refunds

- No refund of entry fees will be made after the closing date of entries.

Transfers

- Please ensure Exhibits are entered in the correct class at time of entry.
- No Exhibit will be transferred to another class after the closing date of entries.

Property Identification Number (PIC)

- Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia Incorporated PIC number is WCSG0001.

Stock Movements

- It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to adhere to Australian Welfare Standards and Guidelines regarding safe transport of livestock.
- The Society will notify the NLIS database of all movements onto the Showground on behalf of Exhibitors.
- Piglets that have not been weaned and are moving with their mother are exempt from identification.

Unloading/Loading

- All pigs must be unloaded and loaded in the designated areas.
- Pigs are not permitted onsite prior to the designated times without approval from the Royal Agricultural Society of WA.
- All departure applications are to be submitted to the Pig Supervisor 24 hours prior to departure.
- Exhibitors are not permitted to remove their pigs from the pavilion until their allotted departure time. Fines may be issued.

Departure

- Remaining pigs, including sows and litters must remain on the Showground until 7.00am on Sunday, 4 October 2026.
- All departures must be via the doors near Gate 5 of the Animal Nursery Pavilion.

Animal Health

Sick Or Injured Animals

- Any pigs considered either diseased or dangerous, or not of acceptable Show standard, the Society reserves the right of refusing its admittance to or removing the same from the Showground at the Exhibitor's expense.
- If a qualified vet appointed by the Society determines that an animal is seriously sick, injured, or unfit to remain at the Showground, the Society may:
 - A. Require the Exhibitor to remove the animal immediately, or
 - B. Arrange for the animal to be removed or humanely destroyed if necessary.
- If the Exhibitor does not act within the time given, the Society will remove the animal and charge the Exhibitor for all related costs.
- The exhibitor is fully responsible for the animal at all times, including any person handling or removing it on their behalf.
- The Exhibitor must cover any costs, damages, or claims resulting from the animal's condition, transport, or care.
- The pavilion supervisor must be notified immediately if a vet treats any sick or diseased animal.
- All veterinary costs during the Show are the Exhibitor's responsibility.

Requirements

- Porcine Brucellosis:
 - A. Pigs will not be allowed to enter the Showground from herds where Porcine Brucellosis is known or suspected.
 - B. Non-accredited herds must meet one of the following criteria
 - o Have a negative brucellosis serological test result conducted within the previous 30 days.
 - o Be moving to a Western Australian facility approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock that carries out brucellosis testing before release.

Documentation

All Exhibitors are encouraged to be accredited through the Australian Pork Industry Quality Assurance Program (APIQ).

- NLIS visual identifier or brand of property of origin required.
- Breeding pigs entering Western Australia from South Australia and New South Wales must have completed a pig health assessment.
- National Vendor Declaration (Pig Pass) is required.
- The Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia will not accept a plain waybill.

Registration & Ownership

- Pigs must be owned or leased (with written proof) by the Exhibitor at the time of entry.
- All pigs over 12 months of age entered in stud classes must be registered with the Australian Pig Breeders Association of Australia in order to confirm the integrity of the breed stock.
- All pigs under 12 months of age must be recorded with the Australian Pig Breeders Association of Australia in order to confirm the integrity of the breed stock.
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Display Cards

- Each Exhibitor is permitted to display one sign for every pig:
 - A. 1200mm x 600mm max
 - B. Stud name, Exhibit number, animal name and ID Number, date of birth, average daily growth rate, days old, weight and weigh date, P2, mating date if applicable, sire and dam details.
 - C. Ribbons and sashes on display must relate to the animals in that pen.

Age Range

The table below shows the dates on or between which animals must be born to compete in the respective age classes. (27/09/26)

- 19 MONTHS AND OVER (before 27/2/25)
- 12 MONTHS AND UNDER 19 MONTHS (28/2/25 to 27/9/25)
- 9 MONTHS AND UNDER 12 MONTHS (28/9/25 to 27/12/25)
- 7 MONTHS AND UNDER 9 MONTHS (28/12/25 to 27/2/26)
- 5 MONTHS AND UNDER 7 MONTHS (28/2/26 to 27/4/26)
- UNDER 5 MONTHS (After 28/4/26)

White Attire

- Exhibitors and/or attendants shall wear white attire during judging.

Duty of Care

- ***Exhibitors must ensure their own safety and that of all other site personnel, visitors and general public at the Claremont Showground.***
- All competitors have a "Duty of Care" to avoid exposing themselves or other people to situation which could lead to injury.
- This "Duty of Care" extends to the prevention of damage to property.

Facilities & Equipment

Cleaning & Waste

- Keep your area clean throughout the Show.
- Use manure bins only for manure – not general rubbish.
- Pens must be cleaned by 8.00am daily.
- Refuse can be deposited in Skip bin.
- Dispose of all waste and feed properly before leaving.
- Fines may apply for non-compliance.

Bedding & Pens

- Only straw is allowed.

Conduct & Safety

Smoking & Alcohol

- Smoking/vaping only in designated areas.
- Alcohol is only allowed in designated areas.

Dogs

- Dogs are not permitted in the Animal Nursery.

Electrical Equipment

- All electrical items must be tagged and tested.
- Double adaptors are strictly prohibited.
