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Welcome!

Welcome to the 2026 Perth Royal Show - we're excited to have you with us! This manual is your go-to guide for setting up, trading safely and making the most of your time at this year's Show.

Take a few minutes to read this before you arrive. It covers the dates, passes, deliveries, access times, safety basics and site standards that will help you avoid last-minute surprises and get straight into Show mode.

Please share this manual, the induction links and the Site Rules and Regulations with everyone working on your site, including employees, contractors and volunteers, before bump in.

The Perth Royal Show is proudly organised by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, which has celebrated Western Australia's agricultural story since 1834. Today, the Show brings competitions, education, innovation, food, animals, entertainment, and exhibitors together for one of WA's most loved community events.



Quick start checklist

1. Pay invoices, submit documentation and confirm insurance by Friday 28 August 2026.
2. Complete your online induction before arriving onsite.
3. Save your induction certificate to your phone.
4. Book any forklift assistance before Friday 18 September.
5. Plan deliveries around the approved delivery windows only.
6. Bring high-vis vests, enclosed shoes, trolleys and anything needed to keep your site tidy.
7. Remove all vehicles from site by 9am on Show days.
8. Save the EOC phone number into your phone – (08) 6263 3114. ← **DO THIS!**
9. Contact Exhibitor Services early if you are unsure - it is much easier to sort questions before you arrive.

How to use this manual

Start with the quick-start checklist, then jump to the sections that match your site. Focus first on key dates, access times, passes, deliveries, inductions and safety basics - these are the items most likely to save you time during bump in, Show week and bump out.

THE 2026 PERTH ROYAL SHOW

Claremont Showground, located at 1 Graylands Road Claremont WA 6010

Saturday, 26 September to Saturday, 3 October 2026.

Open from 10am* and last entry is 8.30pm.

While the advertised public opening time remains 10am, the Royal Agricultural Society of WA may open the gates from 9.45am as a surprise-and-delight initiative.

PAYMENT		All invoices must be paid by the deadline to confirm your attendance at the Perth Royal Show. Please note, surcharges will apply to late site requests and any unpaid invoices.
CONFIRM ANY LARGE DELIVERIES		Exhibitor Services will need to be advised on any large deliveries to site. Any containers or reefers will need to be approved by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA in writing. No large deliveries will be accepted without prior approval.
BUMP IN	Late September	Depending on your site location, bump in dates differ. We will contact you directly to discuss bump in dates. Bump in operating hours are from 7am to 5pm daily.
REMOVAL OF ALL EXHIBITORS' VEHICLES	Friday 25 September 2026	Exhibitors MUST remove all vehicles, golf buggy, utility vehicles (UV), elevating work platform (EWP), and forklifts prior to COB. NO vehicle movement is permitted after 9am and during opening hours on event days.
BUMP OUT	Sunday 4 October to Wednesday 7 October 2026 (4 days)	Bump out will commence from 7am on Sunday. NO bump out is permitted on the final day of show. Bump out operating hours are from 7am to 5pm. Breaches & Enforcement Actions will apply if Exhibitors remain onsite after this bump out deadline. Breaches & Enforcement Actions will be charged at a daily rate for non-compliance.

Exhibitor access times

We'll advise you separately of your allocated bump in schedule, based on your vendor type and location.

During bump in and bump out, entry to Claremont Showground is available from 7am.

From Monday 21 to Friday 25 September, Gate 8 will close at 6pm and Gate 1 will close at 9pm. No vehicle access is permitted into the venue after these times.

During Show days, Exhibitors must leave their pavilion or area within 15 minutes of the advertised closing time so security can complete the sweep.

Sites must be returned to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA free from waste, gas bottles and oils before close of business on Wednesday 7 October. Security concludes onsite at 7am on Wednesday 7 October 2026.

Deliveries

Deliveries are accepted only during approved bump-in, bump-out and event-day delivery times. Make sure someone from your team is onsite to receive them, as the Royal Agricultural Society of WA cannot accept deliveries for Exhibitors or cover costs from refused or delayed deliveries.

Designated delivery zones – new for 2026

Three Designated Delivery Zones will make unloading and loading safer. They will be marked with cones and signage, monitored by Safety Wardens and used for forklift activity only. Do not walk or drive through these zones unless you are acting as the forklift spotter.

The Designated Delivery Zones will be available at the following locations

- Gate 8 car park (in front of Tom Wilding Pavilion)
- The Emporium (between Wheel & Bull and Robinson Pavilion)
- Arena Surrounds – in front of the Grandstand (overflow)

Bump in/out deliveries

- Deliveries can take place from 7.30am to 4.30pm during bump in/out periods.
- Vehicles must enter via Gate 1 or Gate 8.
- Please use the gate located closest to your site to reduce congestion and vehicle movement across site.

Event day deliveries

- Deliveries can be facilitated through Gate 1 from 6am to 8.30am each day.
- No vehicles will be permitted to enter through Gate 1 after 8.30am.
- All vehicles must be removed from site by 9am.

During opening hours, deliveries can be made through the Gate 8 Delivery Zone. Vehicles cannot enter the event area, please bring your trolleys to assist you to move stock from the Delivery Zone to your site.

Breaches & Enforcement Actions

If an Exhibitor is reported for any behaviour or actions that go against the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Site Rules and Regulations or Code of Conduct, which could negatively impact the Perth Royal Show or safety on site, the following disciplinary actions will take place by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA staff

BREACHES	DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS
First Breach	A verbal warning will be issued and recorded against the business name. The Exhibitor will receive a follow-up email advising the behaviour must cease immediately.
Second Breach	A second breach will result in a second verbal warning and a \$300.00 plus GST fee for non-compliance. The breach will be recorded against the business name.
Third Breach	A third breach will result in immediate removal from site without refund, and future involvement at the Perth Royal Show may be reconsidered.

Use of vehicles during public opening hours is strictly prohibited. If breached, no warnings will be issued. The following will apply

- Non-compliance of the Breaches & Enforcement Actions will result in a \$300.00 plus GST fee.
- The breach will be recorded against the Driver and business name.
- The vehicle must be removed immediately and will not be permitted re-entry.
- Future involvement at Claremont Showground may be impacted.

Dress and Presentation Standards

Exhibitors must supply their own high-vis vests, which must be worn before entering the Showground and throughout bump in and bump out. Enclosed shoes, such as sneakers, boots or steel caps, must be worn at all times.

The Perth Royal Show is a family friendly event for all ages and Exhibitors are asked to wear clean and presentable clothing while at the Venue. The following will not be accepted

- Revealing or low-cut outfits
- Dirty or stained clothing
- Heavily ripped, torn or frayed clothing
- Graphic designs with inappropriate and offensive images or wording
- Political, protest or religious images or wording
- Open toed shoes

Accreditation

Allocation & collection

Accreditation passes will be emailed out once the final payment has been made to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA.

Exhibitor passes will be issued as digital tickets. Please keep a personal record of each pass number and who it has been allocated to.

Exhibitors must not resell, transfer, or use passes for promotional purposes (e.g. gifts, prizes, raffles) without prior written approval from the Royal Agricultural Society of WA. If passes are misused, the Royal Agricultural Society of WA will cancel the passes without refund, deny entry, and require the Exhibitor to pay for all passes issued under their name.

Replacement passes

Lost or stolen passes will only be replaced if the Exhibitor provides the original pass numbers. Once confirmed, the original pass will be cancelled and rendered invalid. If the pass numbers cannot be provided, a replacement will not be issued.

Additional passes

Need to purchase additional passes? Please contact Exhibitor Services via email.

Alternatively, passes can be purchased from the the Royal Agricultural Society of WA Administration building during bump in and on Show Days (payment required at the time using credit card only).

Accessing the Showground

Gate staff will check exhibitor passes and induction certificates before granting entry to the Showground. Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring all employees, contractors, and volunteers have completed their induction and reviewed all required documentation before arriving.

All gate security measures must be followed, including bag inspections and security wandering on entry and re-entry.

During bump in and bump out, all vehicles entering the venue must complete a Vehicle Access Pass, including the driver's name, mobile number, and business name. Vehicle access is available via Gate 1 and Gate 8 only during designated bump in/out hours.

On event days, vehicle access is not permitted after 8.30am, and all vehicles must be off-site by 9am. No vehicle movement is permitted during public opening hours. Breaches and enforcement actions may apply.

Claremont Showground is private property. Vehicles remaining on-site outside approved hours may be towed at the Exhibitor's expense. Offences may be recorded against the exhibiting business and could affect future participation in the Perth Royal Show.

Parking

Bump in / out

Vehicle access for unloading is available between 7am and 4.30pm. All vehicles must leave the Showground by 5pm. Display your Vehicle Unloading Pass on the dashboard so

staff can contact you if your vehicle needs to be moved.

Once unloading is complete, vehicles must be removed from the Showground. Drivers are responsible for finding off-site parking and complying with local parking regulations.

Vehicles must not be parked in front of gates, on roadways, or within another exhibitor's site. The Royal Agricultural Society of WA staff will monitor vehicle parking and may issue breaches and enforcement actions for obstructions or non-compliance.

Event days

No exhibitor parking is available on-site during event days.

Limited paid external parking is located at

- Ashton Triangle
- Swanbourne Primary School
- Lake Claremont (operated by the Town of Claremont)
- Rowe Park (corner Langsford & Guger Street – operated by the Town of Claremont)

A free the Royal Agricultural Society of WA shuttle bus will operate between Swanbourne Primary School and Gate 1 every 15 minutes from 7am to 10pm daily during the event.

Public transport is strongly encouraged during Show week. Visit transperth.wa.gov.au to plan your journey.

The Royal Agricultural Society of WA Forklift Booking Procedures

Need help unloading stock? The Royal Agricultural Society of WA can provide a forklift and operator for \$30.00 per lift.

To pre-book forklift services, complete the online booking form sent to Exhibitors one week before bump in. Bookings must be submitted by Friday 18 September.

After this date, forklift requests can be made by contacting Exhibitor Services. Please allow a minimum of 2 hours' notice during business hours.

Exhibitors without a pre-booking will be required to pay \$30.00 per lift via EFTPOS at the time of use. Priority will be given to exhibitors who book in advance.

Scooters, Bikes & Gophers

For everyone's safety, bikes and scooters (electric or non-electric) are not permitted on site. Breaches and enforcement actions may apply.

Gophers are only for people with mobility needs and cannot be used as an alternative to golf buggies. Passengers are not permitted.

Anyone using a gopher must follow all venue vehicle rules, including speed limits, and must not operate a gopher while under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Perth Royal Show Events

Quiet hour

Date & Time Tuesday 29 September from 10am to 11am

Quiet Hour has been introduced to support patrons with additional needs by providing a calmer and more accessible Show experience.

During Quiet Hour, exhibitors are expected to

- Turn off or significantly reduce music and amplified sound.
- Refrain from using microphones, PA systems, and loud announcements.
- Avoid activities that generate excessive noise where possible.
- Help maintain a calm and welcoming environment for all patrons.

In addition, the Sensory Space located in the Campbell Pavilion will be open daily from 10am to 6pm. The space provides a supportive and inclusive environment featuring quiet activities, a calm atmosphere, and accessible facilities for visitors who may need a break from the sensory demands of the Show.

First Aid

If you require medical assistance during bump in/out or on Show days, **please call the Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) on 6263 3114.**

St John will provide first aid during event days and will be onsite from 6am to 10pm.

St John will be located at the following first aid posts:

- Main Clinic (next to the Police Station near Gate 10)
- North East of the Main Arena (on the Heritage Lawn)
- Grassed area in front of Wheel & Bull

Lost Person

The Lost and Found Person Post is located at the the Royal Agricultural Society of WA Administration Building.

Exhibitor Inductions

Exhibitors will be required to complete an online induction prior to arriving at the Venue. Entry will be denied at the gates until they can produce an Induction Certificate.

Exhibitors are responsible for providing a copy of the Exhibitor Manual and Site Rules and Regulations documents to their Workers, Contractors and Volunteers.

Instruction Steps

1. Log into Work Metrics Induction Portal login onlineinduction.com/raswa and select 2026 Perth Royal Show – Vendor, Contractor, Exhibitor, Comps Induction or access it by scanning the QR code provided on the page.
2. Set up your user profile by entering your name, phone number and email address
3. Create a username and password (use your email address as your username).
4. Complete the relevant induction module.
5. Complete the declaration and sign the acknowledgement section.
6. Add the certificate to your Apple Wallet or Android wallet for access to Claremont Showground. You will also receive email confirmation and can print a copy of your certificate.
7. Gate Access Present your induction certificate in your apple/android wallet at the gates for entry during bump-in, bump-out or show a copy of your printed certificate.

Safety

Exhibitors must comply with the *Work Health and Safety Act 2020 (WHS Act)*, and any subsidiary legislation made pursuant to the same. Exhibitors are responsible, so far as is reasonably practicable, for their safety and the safety of others who may be impacted by their activities on site. Please refer to the Site Rules and Regulations Document for key information requirements at the Venue.

Incident reports

Exhibitors MUST report all incidents/accidents to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Emergency Operations Team immediately to alert them to any events that have taken place at the Showground. Exhibitors will need to complete an Incident Report using the below QR code. An Incident Report must be completed for the following:

- Any incidents/accidents
- Near misses, which could have resulted in injury or damage to person or property
- Theft or damage of goods
- Safety issues and hazards

Product Safety Regulations

Product Safety – Australian Consumer Law

The Consumer Protection Division of the Department of Local Government, Industry Regulation and Safety, is the statutory authority responsible for ensuring compliance with the Australian Consumer Law (WA) (the ACL).

Background

For more than a decade, Consumer Protection has worked actively with the Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia to ensure that items supplied in show bags and by stallholders comply with the mandatory standards requirements of the ACL and do not pose a potential hazard to consumers, particularly children. The Commissioner for Consumer Protection urges you to take responsibility to ensure that you are aware of, and comply with, the requirements of the ACL at all times when conducting your business.

Information for suppliers/stallholders

Under the ACL, a single national approach to implementing mandatory safety and information standards and bans for consumer goods is actively in force. The goods affected by these standards and bans can be viewed in detail at the Product Safety Australia website productsafety.gov.au

Section 194 and Section 203 of the ACL prohibits suppliers from offering or supplying goods that do not comply with an applicable mandatory safety and/or information standard. Suppliers can include retailers, wholesalers, distributors, importers or manufacturers. Mandatory standards, product bans and recalls are law. There are two types of mandatory product standards safety standards and information standards. The safety standards are rules which include mandatory design and construction requirements of a product. The information standards are rules about what information you must give to consumers when they buy specific goods.

You have an obligation to comply with the appropriate mandatory safety and information standard legislative instrument found on the Australian Competition and Consumer and Commission's website – productsafety.gov.au

Our Surveillance

Our inspectors may conduct pre-show inspections during bump in of suppliers and stallholders who wish to exhibit items for sale at the Perth Royal Show.

Inspectors will also be attending the Royal Show and conducting on-site surveillance and proactive inspections relating to non-compliant items being offered for supply. Fines and penalties of up to \$50,000,000.00 for a body corporate or \$2,500,000.00 for individual proprietors may apply if products are found that do not comply with these standards. Infringements have been issued in the past to showbag suppliers, stallholders and amusement operators and repeat offences may be subject to prosecution.

Since 2022, the Commissioner has issued up to (\$97,680.00) in Fines and Penalties to Exhibitors who were found to be selling goods at the Perth Royal Show that were non-compliant with the mandatory safety and information standards.

Conclusion

Each vendor at the Perth Royal Show accepts responsibility to ensure any items supplied and provided for sale comply with the requirements of the ACL. This may mean withdrawing from sale products that for example do not have a secure battery compartment or require suitable warnings that the product contains button/coin batteries. Site and Stall Appearance

Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their site clean, tidy, and well presented at all times, including during bump in and bump out. Sites must be fully set up and ready for trading by 9.15am each day, with all stock, boxes, and storage items kept out of public view. Walkways and emergency exits must remain clear at all times.

Pavilion exhibitors must not alter stalls or structures, and exhibitors must not damage or modify any the Royal Agricultural Society of WA property. Any repair costs resulting from exhibitor activity will be charged to the exhibitor.

Storage

All storage must be kept within your allocated site boundaries and hidden from public view. Items stored outside approved areas or obstructing walkways and exits may be removed. Breaches and Enforcement Actions may apply.

Signage and Property

All signs must be correctly installed by the Exhibitor and suitable for outside conditions, including high winds. Signs must be of presentable and professional standards. Exhibitors must not expand outside of their site boundaries with displays, awning or signage that impede into walkways or aisles.

The following signs will NOT be accepted

- Handwritten signage (unless prior written approval has been granted by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA)

- Signs that have been installed without weights or secured correctly to all anchor points
- Flashing lights
- Loud or intrusive signs
- Inappropriate signs
- Material deemed unsafe for use
- Low hanging signs
- Blocking sightline views of the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's operational signage or emergency exit signs
- Signs or stickers installed outside of their site, including internal and external to venue

Smoking and Vaping

Need to smoke or vape? Smoking and vaping are only allowed in designated Smoking Areas marked on the final Show map. Anyone found smoking or vaping elsewhere may receive a verbal warning and Breaches & Enforcement Actions may apply for non-compliance.

Offensive Activities

All activities must remain within your allocated site boundaries. Exhibitors must not operate, promote, or distribute materials in public walkways or on other exhibitors' sites.

The following activities are prohibited at the Perth Royal Show:

- Distributing flyers or other promotional materials outside your site
- Harmful, offensive, illegal, or disruptive behaviour
- Competitions or raffles
- Mascots or costume characters without prior the Royal Agricultural Society of WA approval
- Promoting your business from any location other than your allocated site
- Any activity not approved by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA in writing

Breaches and Enforcement Actions may apply.

Construction of Structures

Planning a structure? Please get written approval from the Royal Agricultural Society of WA before installing anything larger than 3m x 3m. All tents, marquees and gazebos must meet temporary structure standards and local government requirements. Scissor-frame roofs and non-commercial structures are not permitted. Keep all structures, weights and outriggers within your site boundaries.

Stands must not exceed 3m high without prior written approval. Exhibitors, workers, contractors and volunteers must install all structures safely and to code.

Tent and marquees

Use commercial-grade weights on every marquee leg and keep the marquee, weights and signage inside your site. Branded marquees need the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's written approval before installation.

Need to stake a marquee? Contact the Royal Agricultural Society of WA Asset Services first so underground services can be checked. Marquees installed without clearance may need to be removed or adjusted at the Exhibitor's expense.

Marquees are not permitted inside pavilions. All structures, including signage, must stay within the 3m height limit. The Royal Agricultural Society of WA will provide ready-to-use display stands where scheme builds apply.

Any damage to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA marquees will be charged to the Exhibitor, including repair or replacement costs plus an administration fee.

Teardrop banners

Teardrop banners are not permitted to be attached to sites in the Emporium (Robinson Pavilion), Royal Bazaar or The Long Paddock (Jim Webster Pavilion).

Environmental plan

The Royal Agricultural Society of WA is committed to reducing the environmental impact of the Perth Royal Show and asks all Exhibitors to support this effort. Exhibitors must comply with single-use plastic legislation, minimise waste wherever possible, use the correct waste streams provided on site, and encourage staff to use public transport where practical.

Balloons

Balloons are not allowed to be used as part of stall decorations or given out to patrons. It is an offence to release a balloon under the [Environmental Protection Regulations 2018](#).

Bins and waste

Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their site clean and tidy during bump in, event days, and bump out. All waste must be disposed of correctly, with bin bags tied before being placed in skip bins, and cardboard flattened and stacked neatly for collection.

Bump in and out

Please use the designated skip bins for all cardboard and general waste. The 240L Sulo bins will not be serviced during bump in/out periods.

Event Days

Waste must be regularly removed to designated Back-of-House (BOH) skip bin locations, including at the end of each trading day.

Event Cleaners will collect flattened cardboard during show hours and after trading each day. Cardboard must be flattened and neatly stacked within your site boundaries to be collected.

Bump Out

Sites must be left clean, free of waste, and in the same condition they were received. Breaches and enforcement actions may apply and may impact future participation at the Perth Royal Show.

- Gate 2 (correct bin will be labelled)
- The Emporium
- Long Paddock Market
- Livestock Area (car park between Gate 5 and Gate 6)
- Hardy Ave (behind Sensory Space)

Noise

Please be mindful of noise levels and considerate of neighbouring Exhibitors, patrons, and animals.

The following are not permitted

- Use of microphones
- Explicit music or audio (must be suitable for all ages)
- Slander
- Political views or messages
- Religious views or messages
- Inappropriate language
- Competitions and raffles

If a the Royal Agricultural Society of WA Staff Member or Security Officer directs you to reduce the volume of music, audio, or any other noise, you must comply immediately. Failure to do so may result in breaches and enforcement actions being issued.

Beverage sales

All exhibitors selling non-alcoholic beverages must comply with the Perth Royal Show's beverage supply requirements. Only approved products may be sold on-site, and Exhibitors may be required to provide proof of purchase for any non-alcoholic beverages offered for sale.

The Royal Agricultural Society of WA reserves the right to inspect products, storage areas and points of sale to ensure compliance.

Further information, including ordering and supply arrangements, will be provided directly to applicable exhibitors. Failure to comply may result in the removal of non-compliant products and other enforcement actions.

2-for-1 ride promotions

To provide greater value for patrons, a 2-for-1 Ride Promotion will operate daily during the first hour of trading throughout the Perth Royal Show. From 10am to 11am, two patrons can ride for the price of one on all participating rides. To redeem the offer, both riders must board the same ride at the same time. While the advertised public opening time remains 10am, the Royal Agricultural Society of WA may open the gates from 9.45am as a surprise-and-delight initiative. If this occurs, the 2-for-1 promotion will commence from the actual gate opening time and conclude at 11am as scheduled.

Code of conduct

Any Exhibitor seen to be engaged in inappropriate conduct or failing to comply with the Code of Conduct will receive verbal warning, fines and/or removal from Claremont Showground.
