The Society's General Show Regulations and Section Conditions regulate the conduct of the Show. Upon acceptance of an entry, the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by those General Show Regulations and Section Conditions.

A copy of the Society's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or downloaded from the website <http://perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations/>.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Section Condition may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

Liability And Indemnity

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to the Society's Liability and Indemnity.

Withdrawal of Exhibit by the Society

The Society may, at its sole discretion, withdraw, reject or disqualify an exhibit. Refer to the Society's General Show Regulation 3.18.

Prize Money

Prize money won during the Perth Royal Show will be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer). Please complete your account details on the application for entry.

The Society aims to finalise all prize money payments by the end of November 2026. Any prize money that remains unclaimed for more than six months will be considered forfeited by the Competitor .

Prize money as stated in the Schedule does not include GST. The prize money which the Society pays to successful Competitors ("you") depends on the information that you provide to the Society.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN) the Society will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. The Society will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice.

Furthermore, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You are requested not to issue a tax invoice to the Society in respect of prize money received.
- It will be necessary for you to notify the Society if you cease to be registered for GST: and
- The Society will notify you if it ceases to satisfy any of the requirements of determination.

If you provide your ABN but are not registered for GST, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

You must complete the Taxation Details on the Application Entry. Failure to do so will result in the Society deducting 47% of the successful Competitor's prize money under the ATO PAYG provisions.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

Insurance

As the Society accepts no liability for loss or damage occasioned to or by any property exhibited, it is recommended that the Exhibitor arranges appropriate "all risks" insurance for their exhibit(s).

Awards

The Society will not be responsible for awards not received by Exhibitors after 31 December 2026. If you have not received your award by 30 November 2026, please contact the Royal Agricultural Society of WA on (08) 6263 3100.

Promotion

No advertising or promotion on behalf of commercial business will be permitted on the Showground without the prior written consent of the Society's Chief Executive Officer.

Terms and Conditions

Creative Arts Conditions

1. Restrictions On Number Of Entries

Exhibitors are restricted to **ONE** (1) entry per class, unless otherwise stated.

An entry consists of **ONE** (1) item, unless otherwise stated.

2. Conditions for Entry

The whole exhibit MUST be the bona fide work of the individual Exhibitor, unless otherwise stated. No small business entries will be accepted, unless otherwise stated.

All work MUST have been completed in the 18 months prior to the Show.

No exhibit can be entered in more than one (1) class.

No article or work, which has previously been exhibited at the Perth Royal Show, is eligible to compete. Any article entered which is in doubt will be accepted and judged subject to the person entering signing a statutory declaration that such work has never been entered previously and is the bona fide work of the Exhibitor.

Exhibitors must ensure that their exhibits comply with specifications within each class i.e. number of exhibits within a class, and maximum or minimum size of item(s).

Entries must not be worn or displayed on any social media platform prior to the opening of the Perth Royal Show (except for Cosplay Classes). This rule is in place to ensure a fair judging process. Any entry that has been worn or publicly shared before the Show will be automatically disqualified.

Any exhibit incorrectly entered will be marked '**NAS**' (**NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE**) and will not be judged nor be eligible for a prize and may not be displayed.

Except where it is an acceptable part of the finishing, or where stated in the conditions, exhibits that have been washed or dry cleaned will be disqualified from competition. Pre-shrinking of fabrics, lace and crochet is permitted.

- All entries must display the Royal Agricultural Society of WA number slip on the front of each entered article

- If the name of the exhibitor or any other identification mark appears on the entry, the entry will be disqualified unless masked for judging before submission (unless otherwise specified).
- Masking may be removed by Stewards before display.

Exhibitors may submit any information, which may be of value to the Stewards or of interest to the public.

All framed pictures and wall hangings **MUST** have facilities for secure hanging.

Backing card should be in proportion to the article(s) being displayed.

Large exhibits may not be fully displayed.

3. Refund of Entry Fees

No refunds will be given for exhibits except where the Royal Agricultural Society of WA has excess entries in a section or class and is unable to accommodate them.

If an exhibit is withdrawn, rejected, or disqualified by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA for any reason, the entry fee will NOT be refundable.

4. Catalogues

Catalogues are available at a cost of \$10.00. These can only be purchased on the application for entry and are not compulsory.

5. Sale of Exhibits

Exhibits must not be offered for sale.

6. Delivery of Exhibits

The Royal Agricultural Society of WA's exhibit number will be emailed to the Exhibitor prior to the Show.

The Royal Agricultural Society of WA's exhibit number must be securely sewn or attached in an appropriate manner on each exhibit and the exhibits arranged so that this number can be easily seen on the front of the article, when delivered to the Showground.

Exhibits may be posted to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, PO Box 135, Claremont WA 6910, and it is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to ensure that the articles arrive by the due date, and if from overseas to take into account delays caused by Customs inspections, etc.

POSTAL ENTRIES MUST INCLUDE A SEPARATE RETURN SELF ADDRESSED PAID BAG, ALLOWING ENTRIES TO BE RETURNED AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE SHOW.

7. Display

1st, 2nd, 3rd and Highly Commended exhibits will be displayed. Occasionally, due to limited display space other exhibits may not be displayed.

8. Judging

Judges ARE NOT permitted to show in any class in which they may be involved in judging.

Judges are requested to withhold awards where entries are not of a sufficiently high standard.

The Judges' decision is final, and no correspondence shall be entered into.

9. Collection of Exhibits

Exhibitors who want their exhibit returned by post, courier or air, must advise the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's in writing and pre-pay the cost.

All exhibits must be collected within seven (7) days from the conclusion of the Show, unless pre-arranged with the Competition Supervisor.

There is no guarantee personal items for display purposes such as hangers, boxes etc. will be returned.

10. Awards

Prize certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, Highly Commended and Special Prizes.

11. Theme

Theme Definition – Orchards: Fruits & Nuts

The 2026 Creative Arts and Cookery theme focuses on produce traditionally grown in orchards. Entries must relate to **fruits and nuts that are cultivated on trees within an orchard environment.**

Interpretations may also incorporate the **seasonal blossoms and flowers** produced by these orchard trees.

This theme **does not include produce grown on plantations or vines**, such as bananas, pineapples, grapes, or other vine-based or plantation-grown products.

Creative Arts Classes

Stewards' Choice Award

All exhibits are automatically eligible.

The winner is voted by the Stewards during judging.

Beading

A bead is a small object that can be glass, crystal, wood, ceramic, semi-precious stones, pearls or paper with a hole or holes through which a thread can be used to join them.

Beading is the art of joining one (1) or more beads together by using any thread, chain, jumprings, fireline, silk or the like to make a necklace, bracelet, bangle, earrings or wall hanging in any beading stitch (e.g. peyote spiral).

- Copied work should come with the name of the original artist.

Judging Criteria:

- Artistic merit and craftsmanship.

No identifying names to be shown in articles.

Must be mounted or framed where appropriate.

Presentation:

- Any calligraphy hand.
- Two- or three-dimensional form.
- Consider the use of colour, gold, handmade paper and/or embossing or multimedia.

Judging Criteria:

- Quality and consistency of the chosen hand (50%).
- Layout and design of the overall piece (25%).
- Suitability of the chosen hand to the words used (20%).
- Suitability of the colour, illustrations, presentation, and/or framing to the chosen words (5%).

All entries must be suitable for display as this is a family friendly event.

Class 25

Cosplay Seamstress Outfit

Garment made using machines and hand sewing as main forms of construction. 70% of the garment must be fabric. Garment can be embellished using leather, metalwork, sequins, beading, or a combination of embellishments. Garment must be able to be worn. Please supply a mannequin for display.

Armor Smith Outfit

Crochet

Where fabric and crochet are combined, pre-shrinking is permitted.

We encourage the use of natural fibres across all crochet classes. Classes that specifically stipulate natural fibres must be made entirely from natural fibres, while other classes may incorporate a blend of natural and synthetic materials.

For Dolls and Toys, please refer to the Dolls and Toys category.

All handspun articles are to be entered in the Spinning - Hand category only, unless otherwise stated.

Ribbons are permitted for competition purposes only.

No shank buttons on baby wear.

No daisy wheel work to be entered

Exhibitors must provide ball bands and sample yarn for all classes that require the use of natural fibres or where natural fibers are used.

Dolls & Toys

The clothing on Dolls and Toys is included in judging and needs to be properly finished.

No shank buttons on baby wear.

Matching threads should be used on materials.

Stuffing should be even, consistent and appropriate to the toy (e.g. firm, slightly floppy etc.).

Joins where filling is inserted should be invisible. Ladder stitch is suggested.

Ensure eyes are firmly attached to the toy.

The originality of exhibits will be taken into consideration.

Exhibits to be on appropriate, safe and secure stands to facilitate best display used.

Cookery Conditions

1. Restrictions On Number Of Entries

Exhibitors are restricted to **ONE** (1) entry per class, unless otherwise stated.

2. Conditions For Entry

The whole exhibit MUST be the bona fide work of the individual Exhibitor. No Small Business entries will be accepted, unless otherwise stated.

No exhibit can be entered in more than one (1) class, unless otherwise stated.

Exhibitors must ensure that their exhibits comply with the specifications within each class i.e. number of exhibits within a class, maximum or minimum size, and shape.

All exhibits, apart from those entered in the Decorated Cakes and Fruit Cakes and Puddings categories, become the property of the Royal Agricultural Society of WA once delivered, and will be disposed of after the conclusion of the Show for health and safety reasons.

Any exhibit which becomes mouldy or unsuitable for display will be removed. Burnt and undercooked cakes, which have collapsed, may not be displayed.

Exhibits are not to be iced, decorated or appear decorated unless otherwise stated. Cakes to be baked in square or round tins, unless otherwise stated. Ring-shaped tins are not permitted.

Lining paper to be removed for presentation.

3. Catalogue

Catalogues are available at a cost of \$10. These can only be purchased on the application for entry and are not compulsory.

4. Sale of Exhibits

Exhibits must not be offered for sale.

5. Delivery of Exhibits

Jams and Preserves

Businesses/Companies are not permitted to enter this category.

The home cook is defined as a hobbyist and is not available for retail/commercial sales.

Category Rules:

- Judges must hear seal release (pop) when opening.
- Only clear glass jars and bottles to be used.
- All jars contain no less than 200 grams or more than 500 grams unless otherwise stated.
- Jars may be reused however a new lid must be used for show preserving.
- No cloth or paper covers may be used on jars.
- Screw top or twist top lids must be used on jars. Screw top, twist top and wire spring tops may be used on bottles.
- All exhibits to be clearly labelled for identification, e.g. Orange Marmalade. The label to be no larger than 25mm x 50mm and the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's exhibit number to be attached to each jar or bottle, not on top of the lid.
- Jars should be filled just below the top of the jar/bottle.
- Vegetables, tomatoes, pears, and tropical fruits when preserved must include a preservative other than sugar, e.g. citric acid/lemon juice.
- A label listing the ingredients must be placed on the bottle/jar.
- No meat or fish products are to be included in jams.

Definitions and Guidelines:

Jams:

Jams should be made from fruit and contain pieces of fruit. They should have a gelled structure either naturally or with added pectin. They should be balanced in sweetness and acidity. Should be according to class, i.e. if strawberry jam it should be straight strawberry, not strawberry and vanilla.

Marmalade:

Marmalade should have pieces of peel which are edible. Judges will consider if a reasonable effort has been made to use the whole fruit. Marmalades are usually a little transparent. There should be a balance of sweetness and acidity. And should have a gelled structure either naturally or with added pectin.

Chutney:

Tangy, sweet pickle of Indian origin based on chopped fruit and/or other vegetables. Served as an accompaniment to curries, hot and cold meats and savouries. The addition of vinegar is important as it preserves the product. Sugar and spice preserve the flavour and make it tasty. It should be a spoonable consistency, not showing signs of too much moisture weeping around products or on plates. Spreadable consistency and correct preparation of fruit or vegetables, i.e.. peeled tomatoes.

Sauces:

Are much like chutney. Whether a sauce has tiny chunks of fruit or vegetables or contains seeds is a personal choice. They should be pourable from the bottle, but not too thin. Spreadable consistency, with no separation.

Relish:

Sharp, tangy and based on fruit and/or other vegetables. Usually it contains vinegar and sugar, but generally not in large enough quantities to preserve the ingredients for as long as most pickles. They add zest to hot or cold meats, curries and savoury snacks.

Pickles:

Two (2) types.

1) Thick and pulpy, usually vegetables and thickened either by slow cooking to evaporate the liquid and concentrate the flavours or by thickening the liquid with flour.

2) Those that have a clear sweet and/or spicy vinegar poured over various vegetables. Even size, good quality and clarity. Good preparation in peeling and cutting according to type. Onions pickled all the way through. Attractively arranged in their container.

Jellies:

Should be made from the strained juice of cooked fruits. Or from the water off the fruit in the cooking process. Not to contain pieces of fruit. They should have a gelled structure, be it natural or with added pectin. Well balanced with sweetness and acidity.

Decorated Cakes

Category Rules:

Additional requirements and restrictions are stated in each class.

- Base / presentation board must be fitted with cleats sufficient to allow ease of handling. Cleats are feet which are attached to the bottom of the display board to raise it off the surface.
- The completed exhibit including any drape used in presentation must fit within the perimeter of the specified board size stated in each class.
- A tiered cake where each level is not stacked on one above the other must be linked on a common board.
- Novelty & Sculpted Cakes: The majority of the exhibition must be cake, supported by icing techniques and other edible mediums (e.g. Rice Krispy Treats). Model shaped tins must not be used.
- Blocks or polystyrene may be used to simulate cakes unless otherwise stated, but the final design must be achievable in cake.
- All cakes are to be covered in fondant / R.T.R (Ready to Roll), unless otherwise stated.
- Exhibitor label to be attached to the front left of the exhibit. Please read the individual Class requirements carefully, to ensure your entry complies with that Class.
- Cakes that are deemed to be structurally unsound will not be accepted.

Permitted Are:

- A minimal amount of florists' wire, florist tape, stamens, corn silk, cotton net, thread and tulle.
- Edible food grade metallic colour, edible glitter and lustres will be allowed provided the name of the product used is included in the "Information Card".
- Ribbon, braid and cord may be used to compliment or highlight cake decorating techniques but should not be used as the main feature or focus of the exhibit.
- Edible sprinkles, cashous, dragees, sugar pearls can be used to highlight features. The name of the product is to be included on your "Information Card".
- Paper, fabric, lace, ribbon, braid, cord, lustre/shimmer powder. and non-toxic commercial glue may be used on board presentations.
- Thick glass and mirror may be used as base/presentation boards.
- Wooden or Perspex skewers and food approved cake support systems are permitted for support in tiered and Novelty/Sculptured cakes and sugar art.
- Covered boards and hard food safe barriers may be used to support decorations.
- Manufactured pillars may be used to support tiered cakes, plaques, and floral arrangement.
- Floristry wire may be used but must be placed in either a commercial posy pick with the top edge visible above the covering cake, or the wire is coated in edible wax (e.g. bees wax) and again must have the top edge visible. Either technique must be declared on the "Information Card"
- Foam flower centres may be used but must be declared on the "Information Card".
- Edible fabric may be used but must be accompanied by other icing techniques and decorations.

Not Permitted Are:

- Pins of any description.
- Wire which penetrates the surface of the cake covering and the cake (unless otherwise stated).
- Manufactured ornaments and decorations.
- Glass of any description, except as base/presentation board.
- Plant stems and foliage.
- Mechanical aids and any other manufactured material, unless otherwise stated.
- Wafer Paper and gelatine are not to be used as a main feature, unless otherwise stated.

NB: WIRE OF ANY KIND (INCLUDING FOOD GRADE) MUST NOT PENETRATE THE SURFACE OF THE CAKE COVERING AND THE CAKE. A POSY PICK OR EDIBLE WAX IS ALLOWED BUT MUST BE STATED ON THE "INFORMATION CARD".

Exhibits that do not comply with these rules will be marked '**NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE' (NAS)** and will not be judged, nor be eligible for a prize.

INFORMATION CARD: This card will be sent to the Exhibitor and must be completed. The card is to be handed to the Steward when the exhibit is delivered, which is made available to the Judge(s). The card should list new techniques and items used to enable entry to conform to the schedule. It confirms that the Exhibitor has abided by the rules of the competition.

Judging:

The judges will take the following into consideration when judging.

- Overall design and concept.
- Degree of difficulty and complexity.
- Visual appeal and WOW factor
- Quality of workmanship and attention to detail.

Remember, it is better to display fewer techniques that are executed to a great skill level than many techniques poorly done.

Marks are deducted for lack of originality - make sure you create your own design.
