Egg Conditions

1. Refund of Entry Fees

- 1.1. No refunds will be given for exhibits.
- 1.2. If an exhibit is withdrawn, rejected or disqualified by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA for any reason, the entry fee will **NOT** be refundable.

2. Completion of Entries

- 2.1. Application for entry must be completed online at <http://entries.perthroyalshow.com.au>.
- 2.2. Competitors must supply on their application for entry all the information required, otherwise their entries may be refused.
- 2.3. No eggs may be entered which is not the bona fide property of the Competitor.
- 2.4. **Junior Competitors:** At the time of the Show, the Junior Competitor must be between six (6) and eighteen (18) years of age. Entries must be the property of the Junior Competitors.
- 2.5. Once entries have closed, exhibits cannot be changed.

3. Delivery

- 3.1. Competitors must deliver their eggs on **Friday 25 September 2026 between 2.00pm and 7.00pm**. Or **Saturday 26 September between 6.00am and 8.30am**.

Competitors must make prior arrangements with the Competition Supervisor if they are delivering on Saturday.

4. Collection

- 4.1. All eggs will be disposed of at the conclusion of Show

5. Public Display

- 5.1. The Poultry Pavilion will be open to the public between the hours of **10.00am and 5.00pm** for the duration of the Show.

6. ADVERTISING

- 6.1. No notice or advertisement, other than that authorised by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, shall appear on any pen, or anywhere in the pavilion.

7. No Sale of Exhibits for 2026

8. Judging

- 8.1. Judging will commence on **Saturday 26 September 2026 at 9.00am**.
- 8.2. Judges may withhold premier awards, special prizes, championship certificates etc., if in their opinion such awards are not warranted. However, where there are five (5) or more exhibits, a Judge may, in addition to first and second prizes, award a third prize if warranted.
- 8.3. Judging standards will be those recognised by the Australian Standard or the British Poultry Standard where applicable.

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- 8.4. Judges must not award prizes, including Champions and Reserve Champions, even where there is no competition, if in the Judge's opinion the exhibits are not of Royal Show standard or are not suitable for the class in which they are competing. Judges may award a second or third prize instead of a first prize if deemed appropriate.
- 8.5. Where Judges are unable to agree on the Reserve Champion and Grand Champion Award, the Chief Steward is empowered to appoint an independent Judge.
- 8.6. No person, Competitor or otherwise, may in any way hinder or interfere with a Judge or Steward in the discharge of their duties.
- 8.7. No person, Competitor or otherwise, may in any way communicate with a Judge or Steward, until all awards have been made.
- 8.8. The recorded opinion of the Judge as to merit will be final.

9. Protests Against Awards

- 9.1. A Competitor may protest an award won by an exhibit, alleging breach of the Royal Agricultural Society of WA General Show Regulations or Section Conditions or ineligibility.
- 9.2. A protest must be made in writing, giving reasons for the protest and signed and submitted to the Councillor in Charge, not more than one (1) hour after the completion of the judging of the class.
- 9.3. Such protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which may be forfeited to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA if in the opinion of the Councillor in Charge the protest is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious.
- 9.4. If an exhibit is awarded a prize and is subsequently disqualified the prize will not automatically be awarded to the next placegetter. The final decision will be at the discretion of the Judge(s).
- 9.5. Any prize money awarded for an event, which is the subject of protest, shall be retained by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA until the protest has been resolved.

10. Commercial Availability

Exhibits must meet the following criteria for Commercial Availability:

- 10.1. Exhibitors must produce or manufactures its products from premises in Australia to a commercial standard (at the discretion of the Royal Agricultural Society of WA)
- 10.2. Each Exhibit entered must be the absolute property of the Competitor and must be commercially available in Australia or in the market available for export as an identifiable Australian product, or both.
- 10.3. Exhibits must be taken from a normal production run and must be identical to those commercially available.
- 10.4. Supplies goods in the relevant category on an ongoing basis at wholesale or retail level in Australia.

Class 336 **8 and Under - Decorated Eggs**

Eggs may be decorated using a variety of techniques including dye, paint, markers, and applied materials or embellishments.

All eggs must be clean, intact and suitably preserved (hard-boiled).

Entres will be judged as a complete display, considering creativity, technique and presentation.

Class 337 **9 to 17 years - Decorated Eggs**

Eggs may be decorated using a variety of techniques including dye, paint, markers, and applied materials or embellishments.

All eggs must be clean, intact and suitably preserved (hard-boiled).

Entres will be judged as a complete display, considering creativity, technique and presentation.

Class 338 **18 and Over - Decorated Eggs**

Eggs may be decorated using a variety of techniques including dye, paint, markers, and applied materials or embellishments.

All eggs must be clean, intact and suitably preserved (hard-boiled).

Entres will be judged as a complete display, considering creativity, technique and presentation.

General Regulations

The Society's General Show Regulations and Section Conditions regulate the conduct of the Show. Upon acceptance of an entry the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by those General Show Regulations and Section Conditions.

A copy of the Society's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or from the website perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Section Condition may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

The Society may publish to:

- a. all Royal Show Societies in Australia;
- b. the relevant Breed Society; and
- c. the body with which the exhibit is registered, or is eligible for registration, the result of any proceedings before the Disciplinary Committee in which a person has been found to have breached any General Show Regulation or Section Condition.

The Society may recognise and act upon any penalty imposed by any other similar society, organisation or body in Australia on any person or exhibit. It is in the Exhibitor's best interests to carefully read all conditions.

Insurance

The Owner/Exhibitor is responsible for the insurance of their exhibit whilst the exhibit is on the Society's Showground.

Damages

The Owner/Exhibitor shall be liable to reimburse the Society for any damage, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred, or likely to be incurred, by the Society arising from the withdrawal of an exhibit.

Withdrawal of Exhibit by the Society

The Society may, at its sole discretion, withdraw, reject or disqualify an exhibit. Refer to the Society's General Show Regulation 3.18.

Dangerous, Objectionable or Diseased Exhibits

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the Society's General Show Regulation 4.7 and 4.8, with reference to dangerous, objectionable or diseased exhibits.

Prize Money

Prize money won during the Perth Royal Show will be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer). Please complete your account details on the application for entry.

The Society aims to finalise all prize money payments by the end of November. Any prize money that remains unclaimed for more than six months will be considered forfeited by the Competitor.

Prize money as stated in the Schedule does not include GST. The prize money which the Society pays to successful Competitors ("you") depends on the information that you provide to the Society.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN) the Society will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. The Society will provide you with a Recipient Created Tax Invoice.

Furthermore, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You are requested not to issue a tax invoice to the Society in respect of prize money received.
- It will be necessary for you to notify the Society if you cease to be registered for GST: and
- The Society will notify you if it ceases to satisfy any of the requirements of determination.

If you provide your ABN but are not registered for GST, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

You must complete the Taxation Details on the Application Entry. Failure to do so will result in the Society deducting 47% of the successful Competitor's prize money under the ATO PAYG provisions.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

Awards

The Society will not be responsible for awards not received by Exhibitors after 31 December 2026. If you have not received your award by 30 November 2026, please contact the Royal Agricultural Society of WA on (08) 6263 3100.

Society's Liability

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to the Society's Liability.

Promotion

No advertising or promotion on behalf of commercial businesses will be permitted on the Showground without the prior written consent of the Society's Chief Executive Officer.

Privacy Act Statement

The information provided by the Exhibitor in the application for entry is collected and used by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA to organise and conduct competitions at the Show. We may publish details such as your name, address and exhibit details in any Royal Agricultural Society of WA publication or communication. Such information may also be made available to, and published by, the media. We will not disclose your information without your consent for any other purpose unless required or authorised by law. You may request access to your personal information and, if necessary, request that our records of that information be corrected by writing to the Chief Executive Officer at the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, PO Box 135, Claremont WA 6910.
