

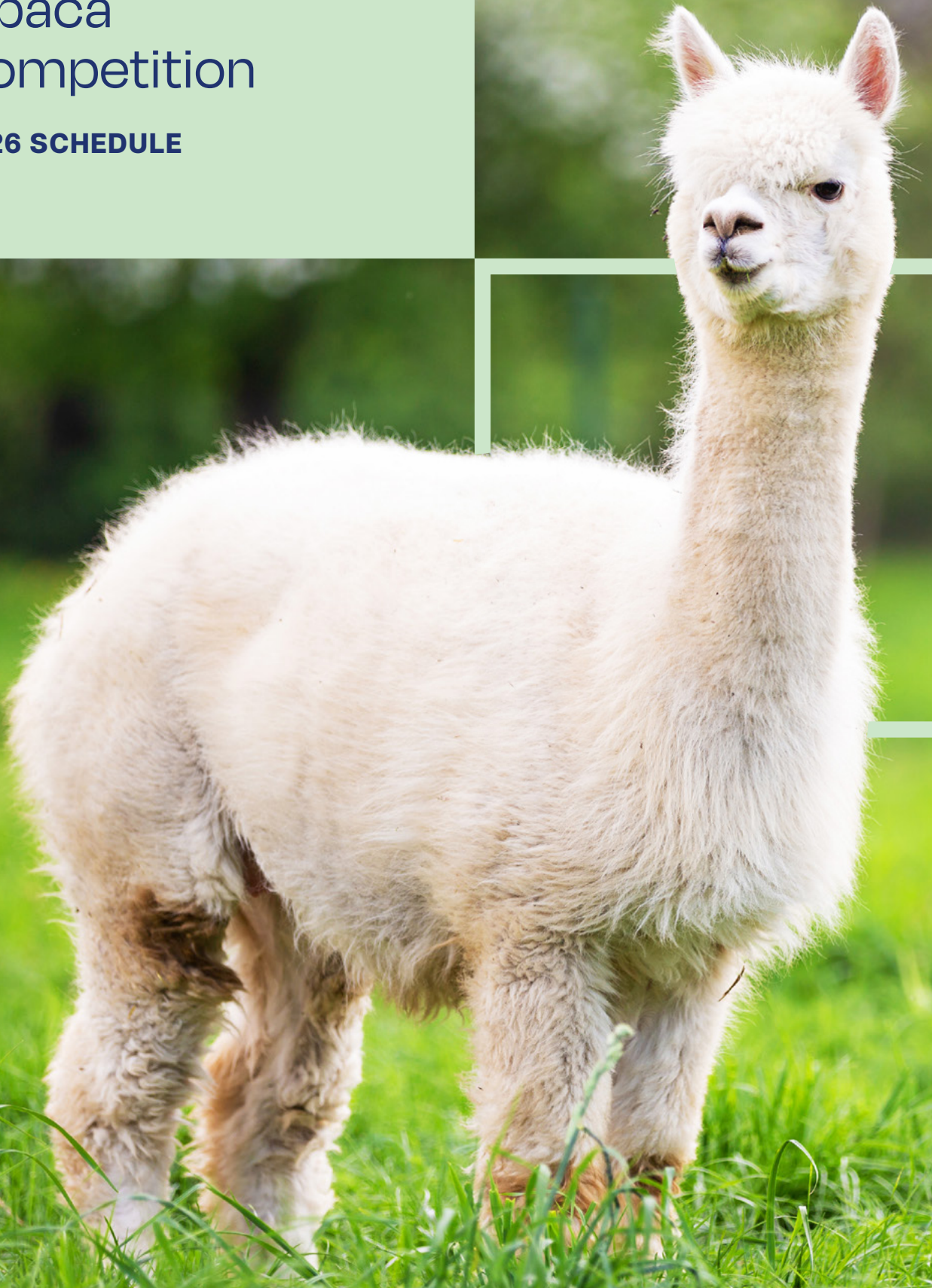

Terms and Conditions

General Regulations

The General Show Regulations apply to all competitions of the Show. These Conditions apply to the Alpaca Fleece Competition only. If there is inconsistency between the General Show Regulations and these Conditions for the Alpaca Fleece competition, these Conditions prevail.

Upon acceptance of an entry, the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by the General Show Regulations and these Conditions.

A copy of Royal Agricultural Society of WA's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or downloaded from the website <http://perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations>.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Alpaca Fleece Conditions may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

Royal Agricultural Society of WA may recognise and act upon any penalty imposed by any other similar society, organisation or body in Australia on any person or exhibit.

Liability And Indemnity

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Liability and Indemnity.

Alpaca Conditions

1. Conditions of Entry

Any competitor giving an incorrect description of their entry with the intention of deceiving or defrauding the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, shall be disqualified from entering at any future Perth Royal Shows.

The Royal Agricultural Society of WA may, at its sole discretion, require a competitor to make a Statutory Declaration regarding their entries.

The Royal Agricultural Society of WA reserves the right to combine colour classes if there are insufficient entries in any one (1) class.

2. Event Schedule

The Silver Jubilee Pavilion will be open to the public from 10am to 6pm daily.

Fleece judging will take place on Saturday, 26 September 2026, followed by Halter judging on Sunday, 27 September 2026, and Youth and Junior Judging on Monday, 28 September 2026.

A presentation ceremony and informal dinner for Competitors, Stewards and Judges will be held on Sunday, 27 September 2026 following the completion of judging.

3. Eligibility and Registration

Open to all registered Alpaca Breeders.

No companion animals are permitted other than crias. The registered owner of an entry must be a financial member of the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd. A person or stud who, at the time of the Show, is not the person or stud in whose name the animal is registered on the IAR, is ineligible to enter that animal.

Alpacas must be registered in a recognised Herd Book. The registered number of the animal together with full breeding details of sire and dam must be provided with each entry.

4. Inspection

Each animal may be subject to inspection and/or examination by one or more Inspectors appointed by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA.

Two suitably qualified persons will be nominated to act as Inspectors for the purpose of General Show Regulation 3.18.

The appointed Inspector(s) must submit a complete written report of their findings to the Competition Supervisor or their nominated representative immediately after the inspection.

5. Age of Entries

The age of an animal is taken on the first day of the Show; Saturday, 26 September 2026.

6. Entry Adjustments Substitutions

Substitution of an animal may be permitted as a direct replacement for an individual alpaca entry. For 2026, substitutions must be like-for-like only.

Late entry changes may not be reflected in the catalogue.

All substitutions must be submitted by Friday, 11 September 2026.

7. Withdrawal

A Veterinary certificate must be provided to the Competition Supervisor if an entry is withdrawn due to illness or injury.

To assist with penning planning, Competitors must notify the Competition Supervisor of any withdrawals by emailing alpacas@raswa.org.au before Friday, 11 September 2026.

8. Refunds

Entry fees will not be refunded if an entry is withdrawn, rejected or disqualified for any reason.

Refunds will only be issued where Royal Agricultural Society of WA receives excess entries in a section or class and is unable to accommodate them.

9. Protests

A competitor may protest against an award won by an entry in the same class alleging breach of the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's General Show Regulations, Section Conditions, or ineligibility.

Such protest must be made in writing, giving reasons for the protest and signed and submitted to the Competition Supervisor or their authorised representative not more than one (1) hour after the completion of the judging of the class or competition.

Such protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which may be forfeited to Royal Agricultural Society of WA if in the opinion of the Competition Supervisor or their authorised representative the protest is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious. If an entry or competitor is awarded a prize and is subsequently disqualified the prize will not automatically be awarded to the next placegetter. The final decision will be at the discretion of the Judge.

Any prize money awarded for an event, which is the subject of protest, shall be retained by Royal Agricultural Society of WA until the protest has been resolved.

10. Youth Handlers and Young Judges

Entries must be lodged on the eAlpaca application for entry. Entries will not be accepted on the day of judging.

The age of the handler is taken on the first day of the Show; Saturday, 26 September 2026

Animals used for Youth Handlers will be sourced from animals already on site for competition. If a Competitor does not have an animal to show, it is their responsibility to arrange a suitable animal with another competitor on site.

Dress code for the Youth Handlers is safe and inspired by the Australian Stockman. This includes closed shoes (black or brown boots preferably), long trousers (not leggings), collared long sleeved shirt minimal/no loose jewelry and hair tied up. Hats are optional as the event is inside.

Dress code for the Young Judges is more formal than Youth Handlers, requiring a jacket plus the Youth Handlers uniform.

11. Advertising and Signage

No notice or advertisement, other than that authorised by Royal Agricultural Society of WA, shall appear on any show pen, or anywhere in the pavilion.

Competitors must not display any material that, in the opinion of Stewards, could influence the Judge.

Stud promotional signage may be displayed on pens from the first day of the Show, provided it does not exceed the height of the pen.

Advertising the sale of animals is not permitted.

12. Arrival and Departure

Arrival

Competitor access to the Showgrounds will be via Gate 6, with exit via Gate 5. Both gates are located on Graylands Road.

Competitors must arrive either on Friday, 25 September 2026 between 12 noon and 6pm, or on Saturday, 26 September 2026 between 5am and 9.30am.

All animals must be penned and ready by 10am on Saturday, 26 September 2026.

Vehicles and trailers must be removed from the Showgrounds immediately following unloading. Parking is available at Irwin Barracks at a cost of \$10 per day and can be booked at the time of entry.

Departure

A Livestock Release Authority Form must be completed and approved before leaving the Showground.

Departure days and times will be allocated by the Competition Supervisor after entries have closed.

Competitors must adhere to their designated departure time, as access through the gates will only be permitted during approved periods.

Departures will be allocated either Monday, 28 September from 6pm or Tuesday, 29 September between 6pm and 8pm, depending on Competitor location and operational requirements.

Competitors must follow their allocated departure time as directed.

Early Departure

Pregnant females may depart the Showground early if either of the following conditions are met and records are provided to the Competition Supervisor in writing before the Show commences, who will authorise any departure.

- An ultrasound certificate confirming pregnancy is produced.
- An active mating record in eAlpaca is produced for a female 18 months or older. The pregnancy must be at least 3 months old.

Veterinarian authorisation is required for sick or stressed animals to depart the Showground earlier than the stated time.

13. Showground Access and Ticketing

All Competitors and their representatives must complete the required Showground induction prior to entering the Showground. The induction will be

forwarded to Competitors in the week before the Show and must be completed before arrival. Proof of completion will be required on arrival. Entry to the Showground will not be permitted unless the induction has been completed.

Competitors will receive admission, vehicle and parking passes. All passes will be issued electronically during the week prior to the Show.

- A. Admission passes will be allocated automatically based on the number of animals entered, as follows:
 - 1 to 4 animals: Two (2) multi-entry passes
 - 5 to 7 animals: Three (3) multi-entry passes
 - 8 or more animals: Four (4) multi-entry passes
- B. Vehicle passes must be requested at the time of entry and will be issued based on the number of vehicles required to load and unload livestock.
- C. Parking at Irwin Barracks must be requested at the time of entry and will be issued based on the number of vehicles nominated. Parking is charged at \$10 per vehicle, per day. No Competitor vehicles are permitted to remain parked on the Showground. Following unloading, all vehicles and trailers must be removed from the Showground and parked at Irwin Barracks.

If all passes have not been received by Tuesday, 22 September 2026, Competitors should contact the Competition Supervisor.

14. Fodder and Bedding

Bedding

Straw bedding will be supplied in large bales and moved throughout the pavilion via pallet jack for ease of distribution and safety purposes. Competitors are asked to ensure a minimum of two people assist when restocking bedding from the bales into pens. Bedding should be used sparingly to minimise waste and assist with overall pavilion cleanliness and supply management.

Competitors are requested to assist in maintaining a clean and safe pavilion by keeping pens free from

waste and ensuring access ways remain clear of straw and waste throughout the Show. This will assist with biosecurity, animal health and general presentation of the area. Competitors are also asked to assist with the clean-out of their pens on departure, which will help reduce cleaning costs and keep entry fees as low as possible for Competitors. All required equipment will be supplied.

Fodder

All animals must be fed and cared for by the Competitor or their representative while on the Showground.

Fodder purchase will be the responsibility of the Competitor.

A shared fodder storage room will be available for Competitors throughout the competition. Please note that individual lockers will not be provided in 2026. Competitors are requested to use the area respectfully and considerately to help maintain a clean, organised and accessible space for all users.

15. Livestock Movement and Biosecurity

Interstate Entry Into WA

All livestock entering WA must comply with the import requirements set by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD). A completed Health Certificate for Movement of Stock to WA (Form LB1) must accompany each consignment of livestock entering the State. The form outlines the applicable import conditions and certifies that the livestock meet WA's biosecurity requirements. Competitors are responsible for ensuring all documentation is completed correctly prior to travel. For further information, please contact DPIRD or visit the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development website.

Movement Within WA

Whenever livestock are moved within WA, the relevant movement documentation must accompany the consignment in accordance with National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) and state biosecurity requirements. A correctly completed National Vendor Declaration (NVD), waybill and/or permit must identify the property of origin and destination, including the Property Identification Codes (PICs) for both locations.

All livestock must comply with current NLIS identification and traceability requirements, including the use of approved identification devices and any exemption arrangements permitted under relevant legislation.

Competitors are responsible for ensuring all animals are correctly tagged prior to arrival at the Showground, and that all required documentation accompanies the livestock and is provided to the Competition Supervisor or their representative upon arrival.

The Property Identification Code (PIC) for the Claremont Showground is WCSG0001.

16. Animal Health

A veterinarian will be on call throughout the Show to attend to any sick or injured livestock. Competitors requiring veterinary assistance will be responsible for all costs associated with the services provided.

The Veterinary Office is located at the corner of Edgar Avenue and the Cattle Lanes.

The duty Veterinary Office can be contacted through Asset Services on (08) 6263 3161 or (08) 6263 3146 between 6am and 9pm from Thursday, 24 September to Sunday, 4 October (until 12.00 noon). For assistance after 9pm, please contact Asset Services on (08) 6263 3127.

17. Grand Parades

The Grand Parade will be held at 1pm on Saturday, 26 September 2026.

18. Prize Money

Prize money won during the Perth Royal Show will be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer). Please complete your account details on the application for entry.

Royal Agricultural Society of WA aims to finalise all prize money payments by the end of November. Any prize money that remains unclaimed for more than six (6) months will be considered forfeited by the Competitor.

Prize money as stated in the Schedule does not include GST. The prize money which the Society pays to successful Competitors ("you") depends on

the information that you provide to Royal Agricultural Society of WA.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN), Royal Agricultural Society of WA will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. Royal Agricultural Society of WA will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice.

Furthermore, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You are requested not to issue a tax invoice to Royal Agricultural Society of WA in respect of prize money received.
- It will be necessary for you to notify Royal Agricultural Society of WA if you cease to be registered for GST: and
- Royal Agricultural Society of WA will notify you if it ceases to satisfy any of the requirements of determination.

If you provide your ABN but are not registered for GST, Royal Agricultural Society of WA will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

You must complete the Taxation Details on the Application Entry. Failure to do so will result in Royal Agricultural Society of WA deducting 47% of the successful Competitor's prize money under the ATO PAYG provisions.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, Royal Agricultural Society of WA will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

19. Awards

Placings and ribbons will only be awarded where entries are deemed by the Judge to have met the standard typically required for that place. If, in the opinion of the Judge, the quality of an entry does not meet the necessary standard, a ribbon may be withheld, regardless of the number of entries in the class.

Prize money will be awarded as indicated in the Competition Schedule.

Perpetual trophies are to be returned to the Competition Supervisor at the conclusion of the Show. The exception to this rule is the Carmen Graham Memorial Trophy which may be held by the Perth Royal Show's most successful Competitor until the following year. Replica trophies are the property of the Competitor.

Royal Agricultural Society of WA will not be responsible for awards not received by Competitors after 31 December 2026. If you have not received your award by 30 November 2026, please contact the Royal Agricultural Society of WA on (08) 6263 3100.

20. Promotion

No advertising or promotion on behalf of commercial business will be permitted on the Showground without the prior written consent of Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Chief Executive Officer.

21. Privacy Act Statement

The information provided by the Competitor in the application for entry is collected and used by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA to organise and conduct competitions at the Show. We may publish details such as your name, address, and entrant details in any Royal Agricultural Society of WA publication or communication. Such information may also be made available to and published by the media. We will not disclose your information without your consent for any other purpose unless required or authorised by law. You may request access to your personal information and, if necessary, request that our records of that information be corrected by writing to the Chief Executive Officer at the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, PO Box 135, Claremont WA 6910.

A Fancy Alpaca is to be shown in the Fancy class if it has an unusual or striking distribution of colour e.g. different colour saddle markings.

Classes

Classes may be split or joined to the most suitable age/colour if numbers warrant. No Huacaya is eligible to compete for Championships in the Suri classes.

Huacaya 12 months and older must be shorn regularly so that no more than 14 months fleece is carried at the time of showing.

Upon acceptance of an entry, the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by the General Show Regulations and these Conditions.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Alpaca Fleece Conditions may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

Royal Agricultural Society of WA may recognise and act upon any penalty imposed by any other similar society, organisation or body in Australia on any person or exhibit.

Liability And Indemnity

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Liability and Indemnity.

Alpaca Fleece Conditions

1. Refund of Entry Free

No refunds will be given for Livestock exhibits except where the Royal Agricultural Society of WA has excess entries in a section or class and is unable to accommodate them.

If an exhibit is withdrawn, rejected or disqualified by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA for any reason, other than the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's General Show Regulation 3.18, the entry fee will NOT be refundable.

2. Eligibility

Open to all Alpaca breeders registered with the Australian Alpaca Association (AAA).

3. Registration

Alpacas must be registered in a recognised Herd Book (ie. eAlpaca). The registered number of the animal must be provided with each entry.

4. Age of Exhibits

The age of an animal is taken on the first day of the Show; Saturday 26 September 2026.

5. Fleece Deliveries

ALL fleeces must be delivered to one of the three (3) locations by COB, Saturday, 22 August 2026.

Only one (1) fleece that has been shorn in the 18 months prior to the Show may be shown from any one (1) animal.

Fleeces are to be clearly labelled in a clear plastic bag with identification cards including animal name, IAR/ NLIS ID and exhibitor name. No string, no ribbons, writing, or other items attached to bags.

All fleeces will be micron tested by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA.

Fleece exhibitors have the option to submit noodled fleeces. In line with AAA rules, to reduce the potential to damage or contaminate fleeces, use only 1200mm wide x 1500mm long 80gsm kraft paper as the noodling material.

The paper must be clean and have no identifying marks on it - you must **NOT** write on the paper. Your noodled fleece will be weighed in the noodle and 140g will be deducted from your fleece weight.
