Terms and Conditions

General Regulations

The General Show Regulations apply to all competitions of the Show. These Conditions apply to the Sheep Competition only. If there is inconsistency between the General Show Regulations and these Conditions for the Sheep competition, these Conditions prevail.

Upon acceptance of an entry, the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by the General Show Regulations and these Conditions.

A copy of Royal Agricultural Society of WA's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or downloaded from the website <http://perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations>.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Sheep Conditions may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

Royal Agricultural Society of WA may recognise and act upon any penalty imposed by any other similar society, organisation or body in Australia on any person or exhibit.

Liability and Indemnity

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Regulations 17, with reference to Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Liability and Indemnity.

Sheep Conditions

1. Conditions of Entry

All entries must be bred by the competitor, or owned, leased or syndicated by the competitor for a minimum of six (6) months as at the date of judging and provide proof of the transaction by way of receipts or registration papers.

Any judge appointed by Royal Agricultural Society of WA who nominates sheep in the Ram and Ewe Sale is not permitted to enter sheep for judging in the Sheep Competition during the Show.

No sheep, except those entered for sale or competition, will be allowed on the Showground without the permission of the Competition Supervisor and Council Lead.

2. Eligibility and Registration

Competitors must provide the registered Flock Number of the breeder for each entry. Unless otherwise specified, all sheep must be bred by a breeder registered in a recognised Flock Book and be the bona fide property of the competitor.

Merino sheep are not eligible to be shown in Poll Merino classes, and Poll Merino sheep are not eligible to be shown in Merino classes. Each sheep may only be entered in classes under its registered Flock Number, which must be stated on the entry form.

Individual breed requirements are listed in the breed descriptions of the Australian Flock Register.

Ewes entered in lambs at foot classes must have a lamb that is purebred or registered appendix flock lamb of her own breeding at foot.

A Novice is a breeder who has not won first prize in an Open class at any Royal Show in the breed in which they are competing. Breeders entered in a Novice class may also compete in the Open class; however, Novice class results do not count towards Governor Cup points.

3. Inspections

To determine verification of type, description and eligibility Breed Society standard and conformity to the schedule will be used for inspection; every entry is inspected prior to competing. The inspection is undertaken by one nominated breed representative and one independent inspector appointed by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA.

The inspection team must be able to inspect the

entries for conformity to the breed standard and eligibility for its nominated class.

All competitors are to comply with inspection times outlined and be in attendance to verify if a change of class is required.

Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Inspection Team.

The competitor is informed of any decision to disqualify, and the Inspection Team will complete the inspection summary in the front of the breed results file.

A competitor has the right to appeal the decision of the Inspection Team. A request must be lodged to the Competition Supervisor and Council Lead within one (1) hour after being notified. An appeals panel will meet to adjudicate the appeal; the appeals panel decision is final.

4. Age of Entries

As the industry recognises teeth as a readily available means of assessing the age of sheep, the following definitions are to be used to determine the correct age for various classes of competition for the purpose of the show across all breeds of sheep.

Ages mentioned are a guide. Viewing teeth determines the ultimate classes in which sheep are to compete.

A tooth is considered to have erupted once it has broken the gum. This interpretation is subject to breed inspector's decisions.

All lamb classes No evidence of eruption of permanent teeth. Lamb's teeth (8 milk teeth). 1 month to 12 to 18 months.

Under 1½ years Not to show more than two (2) permanent incisor teeth. Two-tooth (2 central incisors and 6 milk teeth). 2 to 18 months.

Over 1½ years and under 2½ years Not to show more than four (4) permanent incisor teeth. Four-tooth (2 central, 2 middle incisors and 4 milk teeth). 18 months to 2 years.

Over 2½ years and under 3½ years Not to show more than six (6) permanent incisor teeth. Six-tooth (2 central, 2 middle, 2 lateral incisors and 2 milk teeth). 2½ to 3½ years.

Over 3½ years To show eight (8) permanent incisor teeth. Eight-tooth (2 central, 2 middle, 2 lateral and 2 corner incisors). 3½ to 4 years and older.

5. Entry Adjustments

Transfers

In all sheep breeds, animals entered in their incorrect age class may be transferred to their correct class subject to application being made to the Competition Supervisor and Council Lead and approved at least one (1) hour prior to the stipulated judging time, and subject to such transfer not exceeding the maximum number of entries allowed in any one (1) class. The onus is on the competitor to be aware of any class transfers made by the Inspection Team.

Meat Breeds In the event of sheep being entered in the wrong wool type, the Judges have the right to request Stewards place the entrants in their correct class.

Merino Entrants will be inspected with respect to wool type, e.g. super fine, fine, medium or strong wool, and age on Friday, 25 September 2026 after the completion of penning.

Refunds

Entry fees will not be refunded if an entry is withdrawn, rejected or disqualified for any reason.

Refunds will only be issued where Royal Agricultural Society of WA receives excess entries in a section or class and is unable to accommodate them.

Withdrawals

A veterinary certificate may be requested by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA if an entrant is withdrawn due to illness or injury.

6. Days Growth of Wool

All sheep must compete in the wool unless otherwise specified.

Babydoll All entries must be carrying no more than 1.5cm of wool and all adult sheep must be between 45 and 61cm, taken from the highest point on the middle of the shoulder, at time of inspection prior to judging.

Border Leicester Except in the classes provided for shorn sheep, all entries must be carrying not less than nine (9) months nor more than thirteen (13)

months growth of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

Long wool sheep in the under 1½ years class (not to show more than two (2) permanent teeth) need not be shorn, but must carry a minimum of nine (9) months wool.

Charollais All entries must be carrying no more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

Corriedale In Corriedale sheep classes, limited restrictions are made on the number of days growth of wool to be carried by entrants. Except for shorn classes, sheep may compete either in full wool or half wool. For sheep in full wool, 10 to 13 months wool is acceptable. Sheep in half wool will be shorn after the Wagin Woolorama. The number of days wool must be stated on the application for entry for each sheep and they will be judged making allowance for the different shearing dates.

English Leicester All entries must be carrying not less than nine (9) months nor more than thirteen (13) months growth of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

Hampshire Down All entries must be carrying no more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

Ile de France All entries must be carrying no more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

Lincoln All entries must be carrying not less than nine (9) months nor more than thirteen (13) months growth of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

Poll Dorset Shearing date for entries in wool classes will be between 1 December and 31 January in the year of competition. Rams to be machine shorn and untrimmed for all shorn classes.

Prime SAMM Shearing date for all classes except the wool class is 1 July in the year of competition, or two (2) weeks either side of this date. The wool class date is 1 February in the year of competition, or two (2) weeks either side of this date.

Shropshire All entries must be closely and evenly shorn and carrying not more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging. Wool classes to carry no more than nine (9) months growth.

South Suffolk All entries must be carrying no more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

Suffolk All entries must be carrying no more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

Texel All entries must be carrying no more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

White Suffolk All entries to be shorn on or after 15 August and untrimmed.

Shedding Breeds All entries should not be trimmed, shorn or plucked.

7. Scanning

Sheep in scan classes that have been penned should be ready for scanning from 3pm - 6pm, Tuesday 29 September. Please listen for shed announcements.

Only sheep entered in scan classes at the Perth Royal Show will be scanned, at no cost, by a contractor appointed by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA. Competitors are not permitted to scan their own sheep.

Competitors wishing to utilise the scanning service must make arrangements directly with the appointed scanner. Any out of competition scanning is at the scanner's discretion and may incur a fee.

The priority traits to be measured that affect meat yield are

- Fat thickness (depth)
- Rib eye depth or rib eye area

The software program used calculates these measurements. The program uses a formula that ranks or promotes entries that have the current desirable measurements to increase meat yield or have a good correlation of fat and meat in proportion to live weight.

Each entry is given objective measurement points to a maximum of 60 (calculated by the program), and the judge adds their final structural and personal assessment points to a maximum of 40.

The points are then totaled by the Steward and the highest point scoring entry is then awarded by the Judge.

- Each breed to be scanned on a breed basis to make a valid comparison of entries in that breed.
- Only entries nominated on the application for entry in a scan class will be eligible to compete in a scan class across all breeds.

8. Number of Entries per Class

Competitors are limited to three (3) entries in any one (1) class, and Royal Agricultural Society of WA

reserves the right to further restrict entries to two (2) per class, after entries close, if found necessary because of lack of penning space.

9. Judging and Presentation Requirements

Competitors showing British breeds, Corriedale and other breeds may provide suitable leads for their sheep to assist with handling and judging.

All competitors, or their nominee, must be in attendance and responsible for presentation of sheep to Judges.

Dress Code

The minimum dress code required for handlers in judging ring has been determined by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA Sheep Committee as

- Closed in footwear;
- Long trousers; and
- Collared shirt.

10. Livestock movement and biosecurity

Interstate Entry into Western Australia

All livestock entering Western Australia must comply with the import requirements set by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD). A completed Health Certificate for Movement of Stock to Western Australia (Form LB1) must accompany each consignment of livestock entering the State. The form outlines the applicable import conditions and certifies that the livestock meet Western Australia's biosecurity requirements. Competitors are responsible for ensuring all documentation is completed correctly prior to travel. For further information, please contact DPIRD or visit the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development website.

Movement Within Western Australia

Whenever livestock are moved within Western Australia, the relevant movement documentation must accompany the consignment in accordance with National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) and state biosecurity requirements. A correctly completed National Vendor Declaration (NVD), waybill and/or permit must identify the property of origin and destination, including the Property Identification Codes (PICs) for both locations.

All livestock must comply with current NLIS identification and traceability requirements, including the use of approved identification devices and any exemption arrangements permitted under relevant legislation.

Competitors are responsible for ensuring all required documentation accompanies the livestock and is provided to the Competition Supervisor or their representative upon arrival at the Showground.

The Property Identification Code (PIC) for the Claremont Showground is WCSG0001.

Ovine brucellosis

All rams, regardless of breed (unless otherwise specified by the relevant Breed Society), must be tested and confirmed negative for Ovine Brucellosis in the year of competition. This requirement is met through either full accreditation or a negative serological blood test conducted by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

All rams competing must come from flocks registered with the Ovine Brucellosis (Ram Flock) accreditation scheme of the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, or competitors must provide a certificate from a veterinary surgeon certifying that their rams have been

- a. serologically TESTED TWICE for Brucella Ovis with negative results at an interval of 60 to 150 days;
- b. clinically examined for epididymides with negative results; and
- c. isolated from other sheep for a period of 21 days before the first serological test until competition at the Show.

A copy of the certificate must accompany the application for entry.

Ovine Johne's Disease (OJD)

The National Sheep Health Statement (SHS) provides competitors with the opportunity to declare their flock status. The form is included in the schedule and is voluntary.

Footrot

All entries must be from a flock that is clinically free from virulent footrot.

Footrot in sheep is caused by bacterial infection with *Dichelobacter nodosus*. Both virulent and benign footrot start as inflammation of the skin between the toes accompanied by moisture, reddening and loss of hair. Additional signs include varying degrees of lameness with one or more feet affected. Virulent footrot is a reportable disease in WA, and laboratory testing is required to diagnose virulent footrot or rule out presentations of a similar nature such as benign footrot and foot abscesses.

Ovine interdigital dermatitis (OID/SCALD)

All entries must be from a flock that is clinically free from benign footrot or Ovine Interdigital Dermatitis (OID) (Scald).

Where benign footrot or Ovine Interdigital Dermatitis (OID/Scald) is present or suspected on the property, a Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) Biosecurity and Agricultural Management Act (BAMA) Inspector must have inspected, sampled and tested sufficient sheep on the property to confirm the condition is not virulent footrot. Written advice from the BAMA Inspector must be provided to the Competition Supervisor in charge of sheep prior to the commencement of the Perth Royal Show. Competitors should note this process may take up to four weeks.

All entries must be inspected before arrival for lesions consistent with footrot, OID/scald or any infectious foot condition. Any sheep showing signs will not be permitted onto the Showground.

Dipping and/or Parasitic Control

All shorn sheep that are treated for parasite control, including lice or other external parasites, must comply with all relevant government requirements, including chemical use, withholding period and residue declaration requirements. Any necessary declarations must be completed and lodged with the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD), where required. This condition does not apply to sheep that are taken directly back to the competitor's property and are not for sale.

If any entries show signs of lice, they will be isolated and assessed by Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Veterinarian. If lice infection is confirmed, all entries submitted under that competitor's name must be removed from the Showgrounds immediately.

Competitors with sheep housed adjacent to an animal identified with lice will have those sheep treated with Flexolt under the direction of the Council Lead or their authorised representative.

Competitors with treated sheep must ensure those animals do not come into contact with untreated sheep, particularly in the show ring.

11. Animal Health and Welfare

A person who has the care or charge of an animal has a duty to take all reasonable measures to ensure the welfare of that animal. According to the Animal Welfare (Cattle and Sheep) Regulations 2020 stating that if a ewe is known to be or is visually assessed to be more than 19 weeks pregnant, she is unfit for transport.

Veterinary Services

A Veterinarian will be on call throughout the Show to provide services to injured or sick livestock. Competitors requiring services will be responsible for payment for all services rendered.

The Veterinary Office and Medication Control Centre is located at the corner of Edgar Avenue and the Cattle Lanes.

The duty Veterinary Office can be contacted through Asset Services on (08) 6263 3161 or (08) 6263 3146 between 6am and 9pm from Thursday, 24 September to Sunday, 4 October (until 12 noon). For assistance after 9pm, please contact Asset Services on (08) 6263 3127.

Autopsy

When an animal has died on the Showground, the Veterinarian may, at the expense of the Competitor or Owner, carry out, or cause to be carried out, at a place determined by the Veterinarian, an autopsy of such animal to ascertain the cause of death. The Veterinarian may authorise the disposal of the remains of the animal after the autopsy, at the expense of the competitor or owner.

12. Showground access and ticketing

All competitors and their representatives must complete the required Showground induction prior to entering the Showground. The induction will be forwarded to competitors in the week before the Show and must be completed before arrival. Proof of completion will be required on arrival. Entry to the Showground will not be permitted unless the induction has been completed.

Competitors will receive admission, vehicle and parking passes. All passes will be issued electronically during the week prior to the Show.

- i. Admission passes will be allocated automatically based on the number of animals entered, as follows
 - o 1 to 12 animals Two (2) multi-entry passes
 - o 13 or more animals Four (4) multi-entry passes
- ii. Vehicle passes must be requested at the time of entry and will be issued based on the number of vehicles required to load and unload livestock.
- iii. Parking at Irwin Barracks must be requested at the time of entry and will be issued based on the number of vehicles nominated. Parking is charged at \$10 per vehicle, per day. No competitor vehicles are permitted to remain parked on the

Showground. Following unloading, all vehicles and trailers must be removed from the Showground and parked at Irwin Barracks.

If all passes have not been received by Tuesday, 22 September 2026, competitors should contact the Competition Supervisor.

13. Arrival and Departure

Arrival

Competitors delivering entries must enter the Showground via 'Private Road' Gate 6, off Graylands Road, which is open from 6am to 8pm. From there, competitors must travel east along Private Road to the Jim Horwood Pavilion.

Pavilion access is via the concrete ramp on the western side, which leads to the landing deck where mobile unloading ramps will be available. Once entries have been unloaded, all vehicles must exit via Gate 8.

All required documentation must be presented to the Competition Supervisor or their representative upon arrival.

Vehicles and trailers must be removed from the Showground immediately following unloading. Parking is available at Irwin Barracks at a cost of \$10 per day and can be booked at the time of entry.

Departure

A Livestock Release Authority form must be obtained from the Competition Supervisor or their nominated representative for each animal.

Merino, Poll Merino and Corriedale

All animals may depart after 5pm, Monday, 28 September 2026 and must be totally cleared by 12pm on Tuesday, 29 September 2026.

Australian White, Babydoll, Border Leicester, Charollais, English Leicester, Hampshire Down, Ile De France, Lincoln, Poll Dorset, Prime SAMM, Shropshire, South Suffolk, Suffolk, Texel, Wiltipoll, Wilshire Horn and White Suffolk

All animals may depart after 3.30pm on Saturday, 3 October 2026.

All Breeds Ram and Ewe Sale At the conclusion of the All Breeds Ram and Ewe Sale on Friday, 2 October 2026.

In extreme circumstances, arrangements for early departure can be made with the Competition Supervisor.

14. Penning

All entries must be penned by the times stated below for each breed. If unavoidably delayed in transit, special arrangements are to be made with the Competition Supervisor in the Jim Horwood Pavilion.

It will be the responsibility of the competitor or their agent to place the sheep in pens allocated to them in whatever order they desire to best show off their entries. Pen numbers bear no relation to their catalogue number. Once penned, the pen number can then be written on the catalogue tag for management purposes. Prior to the penning, no entry except those entered for competition shall be allowed in the competition pens.

After being penned, only breed society officials, competitors or their representatives are allowed to handle sheep prior to being judged. Any person breaching this condition is liable to expulsion from the Showground.

Any competitor who fails to present their entry for judging forfeits the stalls or pens allocated to those animals.

15. Fodder and bedding

Fodder

All animals must be fed and cared for by the competitor or their representative while on the Showgrounds.

All fodder must be purchased at the time of entry.

Feed lockers may also be reserved at the time of entry. Lockers measure 180cm x 130cm x 130cm and are available at a cost of \$2.50 each, payable with entries. Competitors must supply their own locks if required. More than one locker may only be allocated where more than 10 entries have been submitted. All unused feed must be removed from lockers prior to departure.

Bedding

Bedding will be supplied by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA. Competitors are requested to be as economical as possible in their use of bedding.

Each pen will be filled with sufficient straw at the start of competition.

Replenishment bedding will be supplied in larger bales and moved throughout the pavilion via pallet jack for ease of distribution and safety purposes. Competitors are asked to ensure a minimum of two people to assist when restocking bedding from the bales into pens. Bedding should be used sparingly to minimise waste and assist with overall pavilion cleanliness and supply management.

Extra bedding can be purchased at time of entry.

Cleaning of Pens

The cleaning of pens is the responsibility of the competitor. Pens must be kept clean and tidy throughout the Show, with waste and excess bedding removed regularly to assist with biosecurity, animal welfare and public presentation.

Height of straw must never be allowed to build up above 200mm from the base of the pen.

To reduce bedding use and odour build-up, competitors must remove soiled bedding rather than continually adding fresh straw. For rams, soiled bedding should be removed from the centre of the pen, with clean straw pulled in from the edges and topped up only as needed. For ewes, this process may need to be reversed where the centre bedding remains clean. If this requirement is not followed, charges for additional straw may apply.

All straw from pens must be placed at the end of aisles by no later than 8am every day. Shed staff will be closing off access to the main alleyway at 8am to allow machinery to operate safely. Fresh straw will be made available from 6.30am each morning.

Competitors are not required to clean out pens on the last Saturday of the Show

16. Electrical Devices and Cords

Any competitor bringing electrical equipment onto the Showground must ensure all leads, tools, appliances and power boards are fitted with residual current protection where required, and have been inspected and currently tagged by a licensed electrical contractor.

Double adaptors are prohibited.

17. Prize Money

Only registered members of the Australian Stud Sheep Breeders Association (ASSBA) are eligible to receive ASSBA prize money in the Meat Breed Stud section of the Show.

Prize money won during the Perth Royal Show will be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer). Please complete your account details on the application for entry.

Royal Agricultural Society of WA aims to finalise all prize money payments by the end of November. Any prize money that remains unclaimed for more than six (6) months will be considered forfeited by the Competitor.

Prize money as stated in the Schedule does not include GST. The prize money which the Society pays to successful Competitors ("you") depends on

the information that you provide to Royal Agricultural Society of WA

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN), Royal Agricultural Society of WA will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. Royal Agricultural Society of WA will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice.

Furthermore, you acknowledge your agreement to the following

- You are requested not to issue a tax invoice to Royal Agricultural Society of WA in respect of prize money received.
- It will be necessary for you to notify Royal Agricultural Society of WA if you cease to be registered for GST and
- Royal Agricultural Society of WA will notify you if it ceases to satisfy any of the requirements of determination.

If you provide your ABN but are not registered for GST, Royal Agricultural Society of WA will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

You must complete the Taxation Details on the Application Entry. Failure to do so will result in Royal Agricultural Society of WA deducting 47% of the successful Competitor's prize money under the ATO PAYG provisions.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, Royal Agricultural Society of WA will pay the prize money as detailed in the Schedule.

18. Awards

No advertising or promotion on behalf of commercial business will be permitted on the Showground without the prior written consent of Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Chief Executive Officer.

The information provided by the competitor in the application for entry is collected and used by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA to organise and conduct competitions at the Show. We may publish details such as your name, address, and entrant details in any Royal Agricultural Society of WA publication or communication. Such information may also be made available to and published by the media. We will not disclose your information without your consent for any other purpose unless required or authorised by law. You may request access to your personal information and, if necessary, request that our records of that information be corrected by writing to the Chief Executive Officer at the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, PO Box 135, Claremont WA 6910.

Livestock Sales Regulations

Sale Nomination Requirements

Rams and ewes intended for sale must be nominated through the Royal Agricultural Society of WA entry system Online Entries.

Nomination must indicate if a ram or ewe is being offered in the sale.

Please be aware that a minimum price of \$2,000 for rams and \$500 for ewes will be the reserve price set on the Sale Day by Sale Agents.

All rams and ewes must be registered with relevant Breed Societies.

Animal movement and biosecurity

Sale sheep must comply with all National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) requirements. From 1 July 2026, all sheep must be identified with an approved NLIS electronic identification device before leaving any property or facility. Each device must be linked to the Property Identification Code (PIC) of the property from which the sheep were consigned to the Showground. The Showground PIC is WCSG0001.

Before a sale is finalised, the selling agent must obtain the purchaser's destination PIC to enable all required movement and sale records to be completed in the NLIS database. All records must be retained and made available to inspectors upon request.

Competitors are responsible for ensuring all sale sheep are correctly tagged prior to arrival at the Showground.

All sale animals nominated must adhere to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's health protocols.

Order of Sale

The sale order by breed will be as follows unless changed by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Sheep Committee

South Suffolk – Suffolk – White Suffolk – Poll Dorset – Other Breeds (order depending on whether they have sold in the previous year or previously).

Rams will be sold first within each breed, followed by the ewes.

Selling order is based on the highest average sale price from the previous year's sale.

- A minimum of 3 animals (rams or ewes) must be offered to calculate an average.
- If fewer than 3 are sold, unsold animals are included at the reserve price.

Vendors can offer a total of 60% of their nominated animals in the first run of each breed and then sell the remainder in subsequent runs. All rams or ewes to be sold out for returning vendors.

New vendors (even if they miss a year) will sell a total of 60% of their nominated animals at the back of the first run of the breed then sell remainder in subsequent runs. If multiple new vendors nominate, then they will be allocated sale order on stud name alphabetically.

Vendors may only nominate a total of two (2) ewes for the sale. An exemption to this number, if agreeable by the sale agents, will be for a genuine stud dispersal of elite genetics.

The Champion Ram of a breed can be elevated to the first lot of the breed on sale day if the vendor has rams nominated in the sale. The Champion Ram is to be substituted for one of the rams already nominated by that vendor. If the vendor does not have any rams nominated in the sale, then the Champion Ram cannot be offered in the sale.

Catalogue

The sale catalogue will be prepared by the appointed selling agent for that year. All nominated animals must have their Sheep Genetics ID or NLIS tag details submitted to the selling agent no later than three (3) weeks prior to sale day, being Friday, 11 September 2026.

The Sale Catalogue will be finalised on Friday, 25 September 2026 (one week prior to the sale). Any changes submitted after this date will not be included in the printed catalogue.

Catalogue will go to print on the Tuesday, 29 September 2026.

Digital catalogues will be sent out across Australia on Monday 14 September 2026, with changes permitted until Friday, 25 September 2026.

Sheep Genetics figures will be entered from their most current run by Friday, 25 September 2026.

Disputes

Any disputes arising before sale are to be directed to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA's Sheep Competition Supervisor and Council Lead.

All nominated sheep are to be moved to the sale pens next to the sale ring by 9am on the morning of the sale.

No advertising material or signage is to be displayed on pens for animals offered for sale.

3. **Ram** Not have a scur or bone knob either of which measures more than 25mm in diameter across the widest part of its base.
4. **Ewe** Have no sign of any horn growth or bone knob set in the concavity.

Shearing Regulations & Eligibility Criteria

Exhibits in all classes are to be regulation shorn and tagged, except for the Unhoused/Unrugged exhibits.

Sheep eligible for the Supreme Exhibit of the Show must be regulation shorn and tagged.
